Important information

Monthly Bulletin of Bank of Slovenia has been, from the number 2-3 for February-March 2007, volume 16, partly changed in its content and form.

The preannouncement of the change has been published on the web page of the Bank of Slovenia in January 2007.

The main changes are as follows:

- The beginning of publishing the statistical data of value, which refer to the period after the entry to the euro area, in the official domestic currency euro. The data of value for the previous period will continue to be published in tolars, as the official Slovenian currency in that period. The data in euros are in the tables separated from the data in tolars by line.
- The change in the concept of the international monetary reserves because of the entry to the Economic and monetary union. Among the Slovenian international monetary reserves after the entry to the euro area, compared to the period before, there are no longer assets in euro as well as the claims on the euro area residents. More explanation is available in: "The statistical treatment of the international monetary reserves at the entry of Slovenia to the euro area" (slovenian), in the chapter Methodological information on the internet page: http://www.bsi.si/en/financial-data.asp?Mapald=64.
- · The change in the presentation of the currency in the circulation to the standards of the euro area.
- The accommodation of the balance sheet of Bank of Slovenia to its activities in the framework of the Eurosystem.
- The beginning of the publishing of the interest rates of the euro area money market as well as the publishing of the whole set of the interest rates of the Monetary financial institutions according to the ECB's methodology.
- \cdot The beginning of the publishing of the financial accounts statistics in the new chapter.
- Colour separation of the individual statistical chapters, to alleviate search and because of the link of the chapters to the specialised publications.

More information can be found in Methodological Notes in the Bank of Slovenia monthly Bulletin.

The entry to the euro area (on 1.1.2007) caused a break in the time series of the statistical tables in the Monthly bulletin in cases where the "currency" is an attribute. An expected reclassification takes place, for example of the stock of outstanding loans in euros from the time series of "foreign currency" before the introduction to the time series of "domestic currency" after the introduction of euro. To enable easier reconstruction of this change, the shares of the Euro amounts in stocks of the foreign currency in the tables 1.3, 1.4, 1.5 and 1.6 on 31.12.2004, 31.12.2005 and 31.12.2006 are published in the chapter Methodological notes.

Current economic developments in the euro area and the US indicate an improvement in the situation. With exports gradually rising, industrial production continued to record current growth in both economies at the beginning of the year, while domestic demand remained weak. Following the slowdown in current economic growth in the euro area in the final quarter of 2009, in March Consensus lowered its economic growth forecast for the euro area to 1.1%, but maintained its forecast for the US at 3.1%. The situation on the labour market remains unfavourable, although unemployment in both economies has stalled at around 10% in recent months. Core inflation remains low, while headline inflation, primarily under the influence of energy prices, stood at 1.5% in the euro area in March and at 2.1% in the US in February. The oil price rose again in March to reach USD 79.3. The euro fell against the US dollar in March for the fourth consecutive month, to USD 1.3567, the key interest rates of the two central banks having remained unchanged.

There was considerable variation in developments in the major sectors in Slovenia at the beginning of the year, but activity in the majority was down on a year earlier. After slowing in the final quarter of last year, industrial production recorded a sharp current decline in January, in connection with the current decline in merchandise exports and the fall in orders in December. Among the sectors primarily dependent on domestic demand, there was a sharp current increase in activity in the construction sector, while revenues in the retail sector declined for the first time since September 2009. The increase in activity in the construction sector was primarily the result of housebuilding, although activity in this segment remains volatile. The economic sentiment indicator rose in March, primarily as a result of an increase in confidence in the manufacturing sector.

The situation on the labour market remains unfavourable, although the negative trends are gradually easing. Registered unemployment rose to 10.6%, but the number of newly registered unemployed is gradually falling. The workforce in employment recorded a monthly decline of 1% in January as a result of the effect of the SORS estimate of the number of farmers, a decline in the number employed in the construction sector, and certain seasonal factors. The average gross wage in January was up 2.3% in year-on-year terms as a result of wage growth in the private sector, which is also the result of a statistical effect caused by lay-offs among the low-paid.

Year-on-year inflation as measured by the HICP stood at 1.8% in March, up 0.2 percentage points on February. The rise in inflation was primarily the result of an increase in the positive contribution made by energy prices and a decline in the negative contribution made by prices of non-energy industrial goods. Persistently weak domestic demand meant that core inflation excluding energy, food, alcohol and tobacco products remained negative in March at -0.5%.

A small deficit having been recorded in January, the cumulative current account deficit over the last 12 months declined to EUR 275 million or 0.8% of GDP, compared with 5.9% of GDP last January. In the context of a surplus of trade in merchandise and services, January's current account deficit was the result of net outflows of factor income and transfers, primarily as a result of outflows of income from equity and payments into the EU budget.

The general government deficit in 2009 reached 5.5% of GDP according to the ESA 95. The largest increases in government expenditure were recorded by subsidies, social security benefits and interest payments as a result of increased government indebtedness. The general government debt had reached 35.9% by the end of last year, compared with 22.5% of GDP a year earlier. According to the available figures, general government revenues from taxes and social contributions in the first two months of this year were unchanged in year-on-year terms. Expenditures were up, particularly subsidies, interest payments, unemployment benefits and social security transfers.


The banking system's total assets declined by EUR 817 million in February. The decline was primarily the result of a decline in government deposits at banks after a sharp increase in January in connection with a bond issue. On the funding side, there were also slight declines in deposits by non-financial corporations, deposits by other financial institutions and liabilities to banks in the rest of the world. Lending was solid in February. There was a net increase of EUR 107 million in loans to non-financial corporations, considerably more than in January. The increase in loans to households was also larger than in January, and was only slightly less than last year's monthly average. Banks recorded larger impairment and provisioning costs in February than in the same month last year. The banking system's pre-tax profit over the first two months of the year was up slightly on the same period last year at EUR 49.5 million, primarily as a result of interest expenses.

The market capitalisation of bonds on the Ljubljana Stock Exchange rose by 0.1% in February, while the market capitalisation of shares declined by 3.7%. The SBI 20 fell by 4% in February.

International Environment

Current trends mostly indicate a continuation of the gradual economic recovery in the US and the euro area, although the situation on the labour market remains unfavourable. There was a slight decline in the volume of retail trade in the euro area in January, of 0.3%, while volume in the US increased by 0.3%. Industrial production increased by 0.1% in the US in February and by 1.7% in the euro area in January, primarily as a result of a rise in the production of intermediate goods and consumer durables. The unemployment rate remained relatively high in the early part of this year. In February, it stood at 9.7% in the US and at 10.0% in the euro area. Consumer confidence indicators were unchanged in March in the euro area, but deteriorated in February in the US, while the PMI deteriorated in both economies in February.

Consensus lowered its latest economic growth forecast for 2010 for the euro area, but left its forecast for the US unchanged. Consensus lowered its 2010 economic growth forecast for the euro area to 1.1%, while its forecast for the US remained at 3.1%. Economic growth in 2011 is expected to stand at 1.5% in the euro area,




and 3.0% in the US. This year's economic growth forecast for Eastern Europe was raised to 3.3%, while the forecast for next year was lowered to 4.0%.

Year-on-year inflation stood at 1.5% in the euro area in March (up from 0.9% in February), and at 2.1% in the US in February (down from 2.6% in January). Energy prices remained the main factor in the movement of inflation in both economies. Core inflation fell again in February in both economies. Year-on-year growth in prices excluding energy and unprocessed food fell to 0.8% in the euro area, while growth in prices excluding energy and food stood at 1.3% in the US. The movement

of energy prices is having an impact on year-on-year movements in industrial producer prices on the domestic market. Prices of manufactured goods were down 1.0% in year-on-year terms in the euro area in January, but up 4.4% in the US in February.

US dollar prices of oil, gold and other non-food commodities rose in March. A barrel of Brent crude averaged USD 79.3 in March, compared with USD 74.1 in February. The rise in oil prices was primarily the result of an OPEC statement that demand for oil had increased, and rises in stock market indices. Prices of gold and other commodities also rose, while food prices fell.


The euro continued to depreciate against the US dollar in March, while the two central banks again left their key interest rates unchanged. The euro fell against the US dollar for the fourth consecutive month in March, by 0.6%, and averaged USD 1.3567 over the month. The euro also depreciated against the Japanese yen and the Swiss franc, but appreciated against the pound sterling. The main reason for the depreciation of the euro was the markets' concerns over the financial position of Greece and certain other euro area countries. The key interest rates remained unchanged, at 1.00% at the ECB, and in the interval between zero and 0.25% at the Federal Reserve.

2 Economic Activity and Labour Market


Real sector

According to initial SORS estimates, GDP fell by 8.1% in 2009 based on figures adjusted for the season and the number of working days, almost double the contraction in the euro area and the EU27 overall. The expenditure structure of GDP reveals a large decline in domestic consumption, which fell by 9.6%, in which a decline in gross investment was the largest factor. Gross fixed capital formation declined by just over 21%, while gross investment in buildings and structures declined by a fifth. The negative contribution made to GDP growth by inventories stood at 3.5 percentage points last year. Household consumption declined by 1.4% last year, while government spending rose by 3.1%. The weak domestic demand was partly compensated for in the second half of the year by strong demand from Asia, which indirectly (via Slovenia's major economic partners) led to domestic exports declining by less than imports. The positive contribution made by net trade thus reduced the decline in GDP by 2.1 percentage points.


The output structure of GDP reveals the largest decline in value-added in sectors dependent on foreign demand. Last year the largest decline in value-added was recorded by the manufacturing sector (16.5%), most


notably in the export-oriented segments. There was a significant decline in value-added in the construction sector, by just under 16%, the first decline since 2001. Value -added in the sector of trade and repair of motor vehicles also declined, by just under 13%. The significant decline in the service sector indicates the delayed effect of the contraction of the global economy, which first impacted industry and manufacturing, and then the services associated with these sectors, transportation in particular. Value-added in the sectors of trade, hotels and restaurants, and transportation declined by just over 10% overall last year, having strengthened slightly in quarterly terms at the end of the year. Year-on-year growth in value-added in the financial intermediation sector was positive throughout last year, and stood at 5.3% for the




year overall. Value-added rose by just over 3% in the public administration and education sector and by just under 2% in the health sector.


In the context of the current decline in exports and the previous fall in new orders, January's current decline in domestic industrial production was the largest since December 2008. According to SORS figures adjusted for the season and the number of working days, the real value of industrial production in January was down 6.1% in current terms, and just under 8% in year-on-year terms. The largest decline, 6.2% in current terms, was recorded by manufacturing. In the breakdown by end use, only the production of capital goods recorded a significant current increase in January. The largest year -on-year decline was recorded by consumer goods, at almost 21%, which was also a reflection of the persistent uncertain situation on the labour market and low wage growth.

Current growth in the real value of construction work performed was relatively high in January, but in year-on-year terms activity remained at a low level. The monthly contraction in the value of construction work ceased in January, despite the persistent relative weakness in the real estate market and the liquidity problems of domestic construction companies. On the basis of seasonally adjusted figures, the real value of construction work performed in January was up 7.1% in current terms, in association with the very high growth in housebuilding. However, activity in the housebuilding segment is the

most volatile of all segments of the construction sector. The real value of construction work performed was nevertheless down 6.4% in year-on-year terms. In the absence of major construction projects, civil engineering works recorded the largest year-on-year decline.

Developments in certain major service sectors in Slovenia improved in the early part of the year. According to provisional SORS figures, nominal revenues in the sector of storage and ancillary transportation services recorded a significant increase in January, as did those in the sectors of hotels and restaurants, and land transportation. Revenues were also up in year-on-year terms in

these sectors. The number of arrivals by foreign tourists was up again in year-on-year terms in February, by 8%. Real sales revenues in the retail sector were up slightly in January, but were still down in year-on-year terms by just over 3%, and according to provisional SORS figures there was no continuation of the current growth in revenues in February.

The seasonally adjusted economic sentiment indicator was up 1 percentage point in March, in which the largest factor was the rise in the manufacturing confidence indicator. The confidence indicators recorded current declines in March in the construction sector and



the service sector, while the manufacturing and retail confidence indicators rose. The consumer confidence indicator recorded a current decline in March, in which the largest factor was the increased consumer pessimism regarding household saving in the next 12 months. The indicator was down 5 percentage points in current terms.

There was a decline in the expectations of the economic situation in Slovenia in the next 12 months, while there was also a sharp decline of 4 percentage points in the employment expectations indicator, which thereby reached its lowest value of the last ten months.

Labour market


February's changes in the number of registered unemployed indicate a continuation of the adverse situation on the labour market, although the negative trend is gradually easing. The number of unemployed rose by 193 in current terms to reach 99,784. This was a bad result compared with the customary February declines in the decade before the crisis, which averaged around 1,300. The rise in unemployment was nevertheless low compared with last February's rise of 3,271. Year-on-year growth in the number of unemployed continues to fall, and stood at 29.3% in February. There were 6,848 people newly registered as unemployed in February, which is comparable to the February average in the four years before the crisis. Of these, around 41% were



temporary workers whose contracts ended, and around 25% were those classified as permanently redundant and those who lost their jobs as a result of bankruptcies. In February 7,007 people entered new employment (of whom 4,034 were previously unemployed), which was still almost 40% below the February average in the four years before the outbreak of the crisis. The number of unemployed deregistering to enter employment amounted to 4,034 in February, a year-on-year increase of 47.9%, primarily as a result of a base effect. Employers notified 11,718 vacancies in February, 4.3% less than in the same month last year. The registered unemployment rate reached 10.6% in January.

The workforce in employment declined by 8,574 in





January, as a result of a decline in employment in the private sector and changes in SORS methodology.

There was a decline of 9,207 in the workforce in employment in the private sector. Most sectors recorded a decline, but the largest declines were recorded by agriculture, hunting, forestry and fishing (5,802) and construction (1,771). The large decline in agriculture was to a great extent the result of a change in SORS methodology for estimating the number of farmers from the labour force survey, as a result of which the number fell by more than it would otherwise have done. The current decline in the workforce in employment also continued in the sectors of the trade, maintenance and repair of motor vehicles (661) and manufacturing (629). There was a current increase of 633 in the workforce in employment in the public sector. The workforce in employment in January was down 4.1% in year-on-year terms as a result of the fall in employment in the private sector, most notably in the sectors of manufacturing (10.3%), construction (7.7%), and transportation and storage (4.9%).

The average nominal gross wage stood at EUR 1,488 in January, up 2.3% in year-on-year terms. After a major upward correction in public sector wages in the second half of 2008, wage growth slowed sharply in the adverse economic situation. The average gross wage in January was down 0.6% in year-on-year terms in the public sector, and up 2.8% in the private sector. The largest increase in average gross wages was recoded by the manufacturing sector, where wages rose by 6.7% in




January. This was to a great extent the result of lay-offs of low-paid employees, which even in the event of the wages of those employees who retained their jobs remaining unchanged would have had a positive impact on the average wage in the sector. Wages in the private sector fell by 3.5% in current terms in January, although this is normal after the December bonus payments.

Selected competitiveness indicators

The harmonised index of the nominal effective exchange rate depreciated in both current and year-on-year terms in February, as a result of the euro's fall against major global currencies. The nominal effective exchange rate depreciated by 0.7% in current terms. The euro fell by 5.3% against the Japanese yen, 4.1% against the US dollar, 0.8% against the pound sterling and 0.6% against the Swiss franc. The main factor in the current fall in the euro was the deterioration in the fiscal situation in certain European countries. These developments were reflected in a 1.1% year-on-year depreciation in the exchange rate.


The harmonised index of the real effective exchange rate as measured by consumer prices depreciated in February in both current and year-on-year terms, the nominal effective exchange rate contributing most towards this. The real effective exchange rate depreciated by 0.7% in current terms in February, while the year-on-year depreciation was 1.3 percentage points larger than in January at 1.4%. Alongside the current deprecia-





tion, another factor in the significant year-on-year increase in the depreciation in the price competitiveness indicator was the relatively high basis from February 2009, when the indicator recorded a current appreciation of 0.6%. The real effective exchange rate recorded a larger year-on-year depreciation in February than the nominal exchange rate, an indication of growth in the basket of foreign prices outpacing growth in domestic prices by 0.3 percentage points.

Slovenia's price competitiveness as measured by the real effective exchange rate deteriorated in current terms in February relative to the most important trading partners from the euro area. The current depreciation in the most important trading partners in January was



on average around 0.5 percentage points larger than in Slovenia. In year-on-year terms there was a statistical improvement in Slovenia's position relative to the other trading partners. This was primarily the result of a base effect, as inflation in Slovenia last year was higher than elsewhere.

3 Price Developments

Year-on-year inflation as measured by the HICP stood at 1.8% in March, up 0.2 percentage points on February. The rise in inflation was the result of an increase in the positive contribution made by energy prices. Year-onyear growth in energy prices increased by 1.7 percentage points in March, while their contribution to inflation increased by 0.2 percentage points to 1.8 percentage points. Although the government cut excise duties on energy, rises in oil prices on the global market and a rise in the special charge for the public utility of creating mandatory reserves of oil and refined petroleum products both acted to increase growth in energy prices. The negative contribution made by prices of non-energy industrial goods remained unchanged at 0.9 percentage points, despite a rise in prices of clothing and footwear as a result of the changeover to new collections, and a rise



in prices of new cars. The rise in car prices was partly the result of the introduction of the new motor vehicle tax act, under which variable tax rates based on carbon dioxide emissions have replaced progressive taxation of new cars based on engine capacity. The contribution made by food prices also remained unchanged, at 0.2 percentage points, while the contribution made by services prices declined to 0.6 percentage points.


The harsh situation in the macroeconomic environment has led to a trend of decline in core inflation since April 2008. One-off effects meant that the decline slowed slightly in March. The HICP excluding energy, food, alcohol and tobacco was down by 0.6% in year-on-



year terms in February, and by 0.5% in March. The main factor was the one-off effect of a rise in prices of non-energy industrial goods. As a result the year-on-year fall in prices of non-energy industrial goods eased to 2.9% in March, while growth in services prices declined slightly to 1.8%. Core inflation as measured by the HICP excluding energy was unchanged from February at -0.2%. Low aggregate demand and the resulting low economic activity are also having an impact on the medium-term trend in core inflation. The trend of decline in year-on-year growth in nominal labour costs is also affecting the movement of core inflation.

According to detailed figures available for February, the largest year-on-year falls in prices were recorded by cars, clothing and footwear, and hospital services, while the largest price rises were recorded by fuels, water supply and refuse disposal. For the second consecutive month, the largest fall among the components of the HICP was recorded by prices of hospital services, at 16.4%. Last year their growth was very volatile, and exceeded 20% in the first quarter, as a result of the elimination of wage discrepancies in the health sector. However, these prices were already falling in year-on-year terms in the final quarter. February saw continuing falls in prices of cars (11.7%) and clothing and footwear (7.4%). The high current growth in prices of water supply and prices of refuse disposal is having an impact on their year-on-year rates of growth, which stood at 30.1% and 17.2% respectively in February. February's slowdown in the current



rate of growth in oil prices on global markets brought a slight decline in year-on-year growth in fuel prices, which averaged at 18.0% in February.


Prices of manufactured goods on the domestic market were up slightly in year-on-year terms in February, for the first time since April 2009. Domestic producer prices of manufactured goods in February were up 0.1% in year-on-year terms, having recorded a fall of 0.1% in January. The year-on-year growth in prices of manufactured goods was primarily the result of a smaller fall in commodity prices and higher growth in prices of consumer goods. The fall in prices of manufactured goods on the foreign market also eased, by 0.3 percentage points to 2.5%.

4 Balance of Payments

Current account

There was again a small deficit in the current account in the early part of the year. January's deficit of EUR 8 million was significantly smaller than the deficit recorded in the same month last year. The cumulative current account deficit over the last 12 months thus fell to EUR 275 million or 0.8% of GDP. With trade in merchandise and



services in surplus, the main factor in the current account deficit was the net outflow of factor income and transfers.


Current movements in merchandise trade deteriorated at the end of last year, and turned negative. The current rate of growth in merchandise exports remained negative in January, while imports recorded growth of 2.0%. Despite the deterioration in current terms, exports recorded year-on-year growth for the second consecutive month as a result of last year's low basis. Merchandise exports amounted to EUR 1,224 million in January, up 0.6% on the same month last year. The year-on-year contraction continued to slow down on the import side: merchandise imports amounted to EUR 1,228 million in January, down just 2.7% on the same month last year. The result of these movements in merchandise trade was a small deficit of EUR 4 million,1 taking the cumulative deficit over the last 12 months to EUR 579 million or 1.7% of GDP.

The trend of merchandise trade with EU Member States recovering faster in year-on-year terms continued in the early part of this year. Merchandise exports to EU Member States in January were up 4.8% in year-on-year terms, while those to non-EU countries were down 9.7% in year-on-year terms. Merchandise imports were down in year-on-year terms overall: those from EU Member States by 1.6%, and those from non-EU countries by



5.3%. In the context of these developments the regional breakdown of merchandise trade is changing: in January compared to January 2009 the proportion of merchandise trade accounted for by EU Member States increased by 2.8 percentage points to 76.5% on the export side, and by 0.7 percentage points to 77.2% on the import side. Merchandise trade with non-EU countries was balanced in January, while merchandise trade with EU Member States recorded a deficit of EUR 37 million.

Price factors also made a major contribution to last year's decline in the nominal volume of merchandise trade. The year-on-year indices of the average value of

merchandise imports and merchandise exports fell by around 7% in the final quarter of last year. The index of the average value of imports fell by 9% overall in 2009, while that of exports fell by 6.1%, the terms of trade thereby improving by 3.2%. The sharp improvement in the terms of trade was a major factor in the narrowing of the merchandise trade deficit and the current account deficit in 2009.

The trends seen in trade in services in the second half of last year continued in January, exports contracting faster than imports. Imports of services recorded a year-on-year decline of 2.8% in January, and exports a decline of 4.1%. The result was a year-on-year decline of just over EUR 6 million in the surplus in trade in services to EUR 84 million. Services related to merchandise trade recorded a larger decline in January than ser-

vices overall and than merchandise trade itself. Imports of transport services were down 9.5% in year-on-year terms, while exports were down 6.2%. The volume of tourism services contracted in the early part of the year, on both the import and export sides. Tourism expenditure in January was down 4.0% in year-on-year terms, while tourism revenues were down 1.7%. In the context of these developments, the surplus in tourism services was unchanged in year-on-year terms at EUR 65 million, which accounted for just over three-quarters of the total surplus of trade in services.

There was a net outflow of EUR 60 million in factor income in January, taking the cumulative net outflow over the last 12 months to EUR 715 million or 2.1% of GDP. There was a small net surplus in labour income in January, but the net outflow of capital income amounted

to EUR 62 million. EUR 40 million consisted of the net outflow of income from equity, most notably reinvested and undistributed earnings. Net interest payments on loans raised in the rest of the world amounted to EUR 13 million. The government and the banks compensated for the decline in foreign loans in the first half of last year by means of bond issues on the foreign and domestic markets. Because the majority of the latter were purchased by non-residents, net outflows from investments in securities have been increasing since the final quarter of last year. There was a net outflow of EUR 29 million in current transfers in January, down a little on the same month last year. With private transfers in balance, only official transfers recorded a net outflow, as a result of payments into the EU budget.

Capital and financial account

The trend of a net financial outflow from the private sector seen in 2009 continued in the first month of 2010. The outflow from the private sector was compen-

sated for by net financial inflows into the government sector, which amounted to EUR 1,349 million in January. Liabilities and claims are still displaying high volatility in the private sector. Both categories declined in December 2009 and January 2010. If the main factor in the decline in liabilities in December 2009 was the decline in foreign loans to the domestic banks (debt repayments by banks), in January 2010 the main factor was the decline in deposits by non-residents at the domestic banks. The main factor in the decline in the private sector's claims was the decline in banks' holdings of currency and deposits in the rest of the world.


After a sharp increase of EUR 1,985 million in the private sector's claims in the second half of 2009, claims declined by EUR 175 million in January 2010. The largest factor in the decline was claims from banks' holdings of currency and deposits, which declined by EUR 346 million. Investments in securities showed no significant change in early 2010. Outflows from house-




hold holdings of currency and deposits were also smaller than in previous periods. Claims from trade credits increased slightly in January 2010, although there was still a net inflow over the last 12 months.

The private sector's liabilities to the rest of the world declined by EUR 591 million in January 2010, and by EUR 1,697 million over the last 12 months. The largest factor in January's decline in liabilities was the decline of EUR 509 million in deposits by non-residents at the domestic banks. Although deposits by non-residents at banks have recorded a net inflow over the last three months, in 2009 they declined by EUR 75 million. The process of the domestic banks making debt repayments in the rest of the world continued in early 2010. In January they repaid EUR 88 million of loans, while the total debt repaid in 2009 was around EUR 3 billion. The most important source of financial inflows over the last 12 months was foreign investment in domestic securities, which increased by EUR 1,861 million.

The government recorded new borrowing of EUR 1.5 billion in January 2010, for the purpose of financing budget spending and debt management transactions.

The government issued 10-year bond (the RS67), on which interest in the amount of 4.125% of the nominal value is payable once a year. Despite the new government borrowing, the gross external debt actually declined slightly to reach EUR 39.9 billion in January. The main reason was the outflow of deposits by non-residents at



banks and the decline in the Bank of Slovenia's liabilities to the Eurosystem, which more than compensated for the new government borrowing. The stock of gross external claims fell slightly in January, but has undergone no significant change over the last six months. It stood at EUR 29.4 billion in January 2010. This period has also been characterised by stability in the sectoral breakdown of claims, and also in the ratio of short-term to long-term claims. The net external debt increased slightly in January to reach EUR 10.6 billion.

5 | Public Finance

The consolidated general government deficit on cash basis methodology amounted to just under EUR 2.0 billion or 5.6% of GDP last year. The state budget was responsible for the majority of the deficit, EUR 1.7 billion. The Health Insurance Institute recorded a deficit of EUR 76 million, while local government recorded a deficit of EUR 157 million. The revenues and expenditure of the Pension and Disability Insurance Institute were in balance, although transfers from the state budget accounted for over a quarter of its total revenues. The state budget deficit amounted to EUR 418 million over the first two months of this year, compared with EUR 288 million in the same period last year.

Box: Basic government sector aggregates in 2009 and Ministry of Finance estimates for 2010 according to ESA 95 methodology

Under conditions of extremely low economic activity, the general government deficit in 2009 rose to 5.5% of GDP, while the general government debt rose to 35.9% of GDP. At the end of March the SORS released the key figures for the government sector aggregates according to the ESA 95 methodology, which form the basis for reviewing the fulfilment of the reference values for the general government deficit and debt. The general government deficit in 2009 was estimated at EUR 1,915 million or 5.5% of GDP. The general government deficit was thus almost 4 GDP percentage points wider than in the previous year. This was primarily the result of the large decline in economic activity, as a result of which general government revenues fell by 1.9%. Last year the most pronounced falls were in current taxes on income and wealth (6.0%) and taxes on production and imports (4.4%). Government expenditure rose by 6% last year, half the rise recorded in the previous year, while as a proportion of GDP it rose significantly to 49.9% of GDP. The largest rises in expenditure were recorded by subsidies (24.6%), interest payments (21.6%) and social security benefits (7.1%). The deficit in 2009 was smaller than forecast in the autumn report on the general government deficit and debt of October 2009, while the debt was larger.


The Ministry of Finance is estimating the deficit to widen to 5.8% of GDP and the debt to rise to 39.8% of GDP this year. According to the Ministry of Finance, the general government deficit in 2010 is expected to amount to EUR 2,107 million or 5.8% of GDP, while the debt is expected to stand at EUR 14,497 million or 39.8% of GDP at the end of the year. The general government deficit will again exceed the reference value this year, while the debt will remain within the reference value. Despite the sharp increase, the general government debt is still one of the lowest in the euro area. The Ministry of Finance estimates for the general government deficit and debt this year are similar to those in the January update to the stability programme. In assessing the latter the European Commission called on Slovenia to set a more ambitious medium-term objective, given the high costs of the aging population, and to continue pension reform. In addition, it is urging a readiness to make further cuts in expenditure if the macroeconomic variables fail to move as favourably as assumed in the stability programme. In line with government policy, the fiscal adjustments in Slovenia in the coming years are to be based primarily on cuts in expenditure.

Inflows of tax and social contributions during the first two months of the year were unchanged in year-on-year terms. Revenues based on total earnings remain down in year-on-year terms on last year's figures. Revenues from social contributions and personal income tax based on employment income over the first two months of the year were down just over 2%. Certain other sub-

categories of personal income tax, such as income from business activities, capital sales and assets, fell by even more. Corporate income tax was down a fifth in year-on-year terms. In the context of a lower tax rate, inflows in the first two months of the year were down around 6% on the final quarter of last year. Inflows of taxes on goods and services in the first two months of the year were up

around a tenth on the same period last year. VAT inflows were up in year-on-year terms for the third consecutive month, partly as a result of the low basis from the previous year. Excise duties in the first two months of the year were up 3.6% in year-on-year terms, but March's cut in excise duties on petrol means that future monthly reve-

nues are expected to fall by EUR 3.7 million.


According to available figures, general government expenditure in the first two months of the year again rose significantly in year-on-year terms, particularly payments of interest, subsidies and unemployment benefits. Year-on-year growth in general government expenditure slowed in the second half of last year, particularly in the final quarter, when it stood at 0.5%. Growth strengthened again during the first two months of this year, according to available figures. Interest payments recorded a notable year-on-year increase in February, when the first interest payments in the amount of EUR 42.5 million were made on the 3-year RS64 bonds issued last February. Agricultural subsidies accounted for the largest proportion of subsidy payments in the first two months of the year, but the year-on-year growth mainly came from payments to corporates for labour market subsidisation measures. Growth in unemployment benefits and social security transfers remained high in both months. Expenditure on pensions in the first two months

of the year was up 3.5% in year-on-year terms. The number of pensioners is continuing to increase. The number of old-age pensioners in February was up 3.9% in year-on-year terms, while the total number of pensioners was up 2.2% (compared with 3.2% and 1.6% respectively in the same month last year).

The net borrowing by the general government sector in 2009 amounted to EUR 4.0 billion. The government issued bonds with a nominal value of EUR 2.5 billion in the first quarter of this year, while a significant amount of debt also fell due for repayment during this period. Last year's net borrowing was earmarked for

financing the deficit between revenues and expenditure in the amount of EUR 1,961 million, and the deficit in net loans and changes in capital holdings in the amount of EUR 264 million, while the remaining sum of approximately EUR 1.8 billion went last year to increase cash and deposits. The state budget debt stood at EUR 11,083 million at the end of 2009, or 31.8% of GDP. In March the government issued RS68 5-year bonds with a nominal value of EUR 1 billion and a coupon rate of 2.75%. This was the second reference bond of the year, following January's issue of bonds with a nominal value of EUR 1.5 billion. Approximately EUR 870 million of bonds and EUR 750 million of treasury bills fell due for payment in the first quarter. The yield on Slovenian 10-year government bond fluctuated around 3.9% in March, the premium over the comparable German bond thus standing at around 80 basis points.



6 Banking System*

The banking system's total assets declined by EUR 817 million in February 2010. The main factor in February's decline in the banking system's total assets was the sharp decline in government deposits at banks, following January's increase as a result of the issue of 10-year government bonds with a nominal value of EUR 1.5 billion. The decline in government deposits was reflected in a decline in the banking system's marginal deposit facility at the ECB and claims against the central bank, which declined by EUR 1.06 billion in February. There was a net increase in loans to non-banking sectors and to non-financial corporations in February.

The stock of loans to non-banking sectors and to non-financial corporations increased for the second consecutive month. Year-on-year growth in lending to non-banking sectors stood at just 0.6% at the end of February, down 0.4 percentage points on January. There was a net increase of EUR 155 million in loans in February, of which non-financial corporations (NFCs) accounted for more than two-thirds. It is the domestic banks that prevail in the still-moderate lending to NFCs, while the banks under majority foreign ownership focus more on lending to households.



February's net increase in loans to NFCs of EUR 107 million was the largest in the last year. The domestic banks accounted for EUR 98 million of this, year-on-year growth in loans to NFCs remaining positive at these banks. Year-on-year growth in loans to NFCs was slightly negative for the third consecutive month, as a result of weak lending at the banks under majority foreign ownership.

At EUR 38 million, February's increase in loans to households was slightly less than last year's monthly average, as was January's figure. Loans to households have nevertheless increased solidly this year, household lending having entirely frozen in the early months of last year. The trend of recent months in household lending per-

sisted: there was a net increase in long-term loans to households, while short-term loans to households declined. Year-on-year growth in housing loans stood at 16.9% in February, while the rate for consumer loans was just 0.9%. The banks under majority foreign ownership again accounted for the majority (four-fifths) of the net increase in loans to households.

On the funding side, in February there was a sharp decline in government deposits at banks, and slight declines in deposits by NFCs and liabilities to banks in the rest of the world. Deposits by non-banking sectors declined by EUR 748 billion in February, primarily as a result of a decline of EUR 688 million in government deposits at banks. Banks made net repayments of EUR 57 million to the rest of the world, significantly less than in the preceding two months. The banks under majority foreign ownership were the main factor in debt repayments. Liabilities to foreign banks accounted for just 24% of the stock of bank funding in February, down about 8 percent-

age points on a year earlier.


The largest decline in deposits by non-banking sectors was recorded by sight deposits, in which the decline in government sight deposits was a major factor, while the increase in long-term deposits slightly exceeded the decline in short-term deposits. Household deposits increased moderately, their year-on-year growth declining to 3.6%. With household sight deposits increasing and short-term deposits declining, the main increase was in long-term deposits. Deposits of 1 to 2 years again accounted for four-fifths of the increase.

Growth in net interest has been solid this year. Banks again recorded relatively high impairment and provisioning costs in February. Net interest during the first two months of the year was up just under a quarter on the same period last year. This was the result of a decline in interest expenses (23.3% in year-on-year terms), primarily as a result of lower interest rates. The interest margin also increased as a result, to stand at 2.1% during the




first two months of the year. With non-interest income up a tenth, the main generator of the banking system's gross income was net interest, which was up a fifth in year-on-year terms during the first two months of the year. Banks also recorded relatively high impairment and provisioning costs in February, an indication of the increase in credit risk. Banks have recorded a slight reduction in operating costs this year. The banking system's pre-tax profit during the first two months of the year amounted to EUR 49.5 million.

7 Domestic Financial Markets

The yield on Slovenian government bonds stood at 3.84% at the end of February 2010, compared with 3.17% on German government bonds. The spread had thus narrowed to 67 basis points at the end of the month, the lowest value since September 2008, with the exception of October and November 2009.


There was considerable variation in the movement of global indices in February 2010. European stock market indices fell, as a result of adverse developments in Greece. The DJ EuroStoxx 50 index for Western Europe fell by 1.9%, while the S&P 500 for the US stock market rose by 2.8%. The year-on-year changes in the stock




market indices nevertheless remain strongly positive (39.4% for the DJ EuroStoxx 50, 50.3% for the S&P 500).


The market capitalisation of bonds on the Ljubljana Stock Exchange rose by 0.1% in February. There were no new listings or expansions in February. The volume of trade in bonds amounted to EUR 7.9 million, down 7.1% on January, and down on last year's monthly average of EUR 13.0 million. The proportion of total stock exchange volume accounted for by bonds declined by 2 percentage points in February to 19.6%.

The market capitalisation of shares on the Ljubljana Stock Exchange declined by 3.7% in February. The SBI 20 reached its monthly high on 12 February, closing the month at 3,953. It fell 4.0% during February, but was






The proportion of the market capitalisation of shares on the Ljubljana Stock Exchange accounted for by non-residents rose slightly in February 2010, but remained low at 7.3%. Non-residents' transactions in February were very low compared with the monthly average in 2009, primarily as a result of the small volume of bond purchases. Non-residents made net purchases of EUR 4.9 million in bonds from Slovenian issuers, and EUR 3.6 million in shares in Slovenian issuers in February. The largest net purchasers and net sellers were again residents of Austria, the UK and Luxembourg, while the largest volume was in RS63 to RS67 government bonds.

Residents made net purchases of EUR 71.5 million in foreign shares and EUR 347.9 million in foreign bonds in February. So far (in 2008 and 2009) the crisis has typically seen high net sales of bonds and smaller net purchases of shares. The majority of net purchases of foreign shares, predominantly shares in financial corpora-



tions and insurance corporations from the euro area, the US and the former Yugoslav republics, were made by banks and mutual fund managers. The latter also predominantly sold shares from the BRIC² countries. The banking sector and, in part, the insurance sector mostly made net purchases of government bonds from the euro area


There was a slight increase in February in assets under management at domestic mutual funds to EUR 1,865 million (up 0.4% in monthly terms, and 31.2% in year-on-year terms), as a result of net inflows of EUR 7.1 million and a rise of 0.6% (taking the year-on-year change to 32.7%) in the average unit price. The largest

net inflows of EUR 5.4 million were recorded by equity funds, followed by bond funds with inflows of EUR 1.3 million, balanced funds with inflows of EUR 0.3 billion, and money-market funds with inflows of EUR 0.1 million. The largest payments into the domestic mutual funds were recorded by the insurance sector (EUR 7.5 million), while other sectors contributed significantly less. The domestic mutual funds recorded net outflows of EUR 0.5 million to non-financial corporations, and EUR 0.3 million to households. The proportion of the domestic mutual funds' assets accounted for by liquid assets3 declined to 10.5%, and remains below the 2009 average. The domestic mutual funds increased their investments in the euro area and the US in February, at the expense of a decline in investments in the domestic economy. The trend of increasing investments in the rest of the world thus continued. There was variation in the movement of the Balkan stock market indices in February. Macedonia's MBI-10 rose by 1.2% in February (taking the year-on-year change to +48.7%), Serbia's BELEX 15 rose by 4.1% (taking the year-on-year change to +67.8%), but Croatia's CROBEX fell by 3.0% (taking the year-on-year change to +54.5%).



IV. NOTES ON METHODOLOGY

General notes

Sectors

For data from 30 April 1999 onwards, a sectorization has been implemented according to the Regulation on Introduction and Implementation of Standard Classification of Institutional Sectors (hereinafter SKIS), published in the Official Gazette No. 56/98. SKIS, which implemented a national standard for economic sectorization, based on the European System of Accounts 95 and is in accordance with the System of National Accounts 93. According to SKIS, the economy is divided into the following sectors: non-financial corporations, financial corporations (central bank, commercial banks, and other financial institutions), general government, households, non-profit institutions serving households, and the external sector (non-residents).

The external sector comprises non-residents; the domestic sector, residents.

Residents of the Republic of Slovenia are defined as:

- companies and other legal entities with a registered office in the Republic of Slovenia, not including their branches abroad;
- branches of foreign companies entered in the Register of Companies of the Republic of Slovenia;
- sole proprietors or natural persons independently performing business activities as their primary occupation, with a registered office in the Republic of Slovenia or having permanent residence in the Republic of Slovenia;
- natural persons with permanent residence in the Republic of Slovenia;
- natural persons temporarily residing in the Republic of Slovenia, holding a residential or working visa valid for no less than six months; and
- diplomatic, consular and other representative offices of the Republic of Slovenia abroad which are financed from the Budget, as well as Slovene citizens employed at these representative offices and their family members.

All other persons and entities shall be deemed non-residents.

The domestic sector is broken down to the monetary sector and non-monetary sectors. The monetary sector consists of the Bank of Slovenia and other monetary financial institutions (banks, savings banks and money market funds). Domestic monetary financial institutions, owned by both residents and non-residents, are included.

Non-monetary sectors are: non-financial corporations, non-monetary financial institutions, general government, house-holds, and non-profit institutions serving households. Non-financial corporations (enterprises) are legal persons – market producers of goods and non-financial services.

The non-monetary financial institutions sector comprises other financial institutions. Other financial institutions are: other financial intermediaries, except insurance corporations and pension funds (mutual funds, investment funds and financial leasing companies), financial auxiliaries (securities brokers/dealers, stock exchanges) and insurance corporations and pension funds.

The general government consists of the central government (administrative departments of state and central government agencies), local government (local administration, local agencies) and social security funds.

"Households" refers to resident individuals as consumers, resident individuals as sole proprietorships, and partnerships being market producers and having no independent legal status. The data of the latter, prior to 30 April 1999, were included in the enterprises sector.

Non-profit institutions serving households are clubs, political parties, trade unions, churches or religious societies, humanitarian and charity organizations, and professional societies.

Characteristics of the data

- The data present stocks of assets and liabilities at the end of the period.
- Data on stocks denominated in foreign currencies are converted into domestic currency using the official end-ofperiod middle exchange rate.
- Data in tables are not seasonally adjusted.



Table: Republic of Slovenia: General Information

The table shows basic general data on Slovenia and its economy. In the "Latest actual" column, the latest available data for the current year are published. Sources of the data are the Bank of Slovenia, the Ministry of Finance and the Statistical Office of the Republic of Slovenia.

1. MONEY AND MONETARY FINANCIAL INSTITUTIONS

Data in all tables present stocks items at the end of the period. Last published data are preliminary.

The change in the reporting could cause some inconsistencies in conceptual definitions of some items in the year 2005 data

Until the end of December 2006 the data is published in the currency SIT, from 1 January 2007 the data is published in the currency EUR. The currency EUR in the data until the end of December 2006 is considered as foreign currency, from 1 January 2007 as domestic currency.

Change of Methodology

In May 2006 the tables of the Money and Monetary Financial Institutions chapter, have been changed. Structurally similar tables are based on the methodology of the European Central Bank (ECB) or of the euro area and no more on the methodology of the International Monetary Fund. The data source for the data of the MFI's in the changed tables is the report of the monetary financial institutions and not the bookkeeping report of the banks and savings banks. The main methodological changes are explained below.

The data from the new tables is available since December 2004, while the time series of the old tables up to March 2006 are still available on the Bank of Slovenia internet page (http://www.bsi.si/en/).

The main differences between the methodology of the ECB and the tables in the monthly bulletin up to April 2006 are as follows:

- The sector of the monetary financial institutions, MFI, contains banks, savings banks, savings and loans undertakings and money market funds, but it does not include old LB in KBM banks, while the banking sector without savings banks, savings and loans undertakings and money market funds but with the old LB and KBM is presented in the old bulletin tables.
- Balance sheet total according to the ECB's methodology differs from the balance sheet total according to the IMF's
 methodology mainly because of the different treatment of the loans. The loans are recorded on gross basis in the new
 tables and net of provisions in the old set. Consequently the stock of the loans is different.
- There is a difference among the stock of the items loans and deposits and debt securities among the claims and liabilities, because of the inclusion of the negotiable/non-negotiable securities into the items loans/deposits and debt securities. According to the ECB's methodology, the non-negotiable debt securities are included into the loans/deposits and the negotiable debt securities into the debt securities.
- According to the ECB's methodology, the deals by procuration and internal affairs are included on a net basis, while before they were shown on a gross basis.
- There are differences in the composition of monetary aggregates according to national definition and harmonized monetary aggregates according to the ECB's definition that are described below.

Since April 2006 the data of the specific balance sheet items (loans, deposits, securities other than shares and issued debt securities) are in line with the ECB's request recorded according to their nominal values. The nominal value of a specific instrument is an amount of the principal, which is owed by the debtor to the creditor:

- loans: unpaid principal, not included the accrued interest, the commissions and other expenses,
- deposits: amount of the time deposits, the accrued interest not included,
- debt securities: nominal value.

Interest, which is subscribed to the principal and thus increases it, is the component of the nominal value.

Description of the balance sheet instruments

Below is a short description of the balance sheet aggregate items or instruments, as defined by the European Central bank:

Cash

Holdings of domestic and foreign banknotes and coins in circulation that are commonly used to make payments.

Loans

For the purposes of the statistical reporting scheme, this item consists of funds lent by reporting agents to borrowers, which are not evidenced by documents or are represented by a single document (even if it has become negotiable). It includes assets in the form of deposits, bad debt loans, in respect of which repayment is overdue or otherwise identified as being impaired, traded loans, subordinated debt in the form of deposits or loans and claims under reverse repos. The stock of loans is included into the item according to the "gross" principle.

Securities other than shares

Holdings of securities other than shares or other equity, which are negotiable and usually traded on secondary markets or can be offset on the market, and which do not grant the holder any ownership rights over the issuing institution. Besides negotiable debt securities this item includes: negotiable loans that have been restructured into a large number of identical documents and that can be traded on secondary markets and subordinated debt in the form of debt securities. The item does not include the accrued interest – which are classified into the item remaining assets, except when the separation is not possible (when the interest is the inseparable part of the market price).

Shares and other equity

Holdings of securities which represent property rights in corporations or quasi-corporations. These securities generally entitle the holders to a share in the profits of corporations or quasi-corporations and to a share in their own funds in the event of liquidation. Mutual fund shares and money market fund shares/units are included here.

Remaining assets

This item may also include: financial derivative positions with gross positive market values, non-financial assets (tangible or intangible), accrued interest receivable on loans and securities, the surplus from the deals by procuration, internal affairs.

Deposits

Amounts owed to creditors by reporting agents, other than those arising from the issue of negotiable debt securities. Deposits also cover loans as liabilities of MFIs, which represent amounts received by MFIs that are not structured in the form of deposits, non-negotiable debt securities issued, liabilities for the loans received and where they are not separately stated also deposits redeemable at notice, repos and traded loans.

Debt securities issued

Securities other than equity issued by reporting agents, which are negotiable and usually traded on secondary markets or which can be offset on the market, and which do not grant the holder any ownership rights over the issuing institution, and the subordinated debt issued by MFI's in the form of the debt securities. The accrued interest are not included in the stock data, but classified to the remaining liabilities. The amount of debt securities is shown net of own purchase.

Capital and reserves

This category comprises the amounts arising from the issue of equity capital, including also non-distributed benefits or funds, specific and general provisions against loans, securities and other types of assets. The item is adequately netted for the own shares owned. This item also includes the difference between the revenues and expenditures during the year and the money market fund shares/units issued.

Remaining liabilities

The remaining liabilities consist of accrued interest payable on deposits and debt securities, provisions representing the liabilities vis-r-vis third persons, gross amounts payable in respect of transit items, financial derivative positions. The surplus of the liabilities over claims from the deals by procuration, internal affairs is also included here.

Tables

In May 2006 the tables from 1.1. to 1.8 have been changed and substituted with the new ones, which enables partial continuity of the old time series.

The entry to the euro area (on 1,1.2007) caused a break in the time series of the statistical tables in the Monthly bulletin in cases where the "currency" is an attribute. An expected reclassification of the data between the individual columns in the tables, which keep the same name takes place, for example of the stock of outstanding loans in euros from the time series of "foreign currency" before the introduction to the time series of "domestic currency" after the introduction of euro. To enable easier reconstruction of this change, the shares of the Euro amounts in stocks of the foreign currency on 31.12.2004, 31.12.2005 and 31.12.2006 are published in the Methodological notes for the tables 1.3, 1.4, 1.5 in 1.6, where the reclassification occurred.

Table 1.1.: Monetary Aggregates

The table shows stock data at the end of month for monetary aggregates M1, M2 and M3, calculated according to the definition of the European Central Bank.

The main characteristics of monetary aggregates under the ECB's definition:

- Inclusion of liabilities of MFI sectors to EMU non-monetary sectors,
- Exclusion of the monetary neutral sector (the central government has the status of a monetary neutral sector),
- Limited maturity of items included (liabilities of up to 2 years and deposits redeemable at notice of up to 3 months only),
- Equal treatment of the liabilities in domestic and foreign currency,
- Inclusion of the money market fund shares/units into M3.

Composition of monetary aggregates, as defined by the ECB is:

- M1 contains currency in circulation and overnight deposits,
- M2 includes beside M1 also deposits with agreed maturity of up to 2 years and deposits redeemable at notice of up to 3 months
- M3 includes M2, repurchase agreements and debt securities with the maturity of up to 2 years and money market fund shares/units.

The table is split into two parts: the first part (before the entry of Slovenia into EMU until the end of December 2006) presents Monetary aggregates of Slovenia and the second part (after the entry of Slovenia into EMU from 1 January 2007 onwards) presents the contribution of Slovenia to monetary aggregates of EMU.

The item 'Currency in circulation' is calculated on the basis of the Capital Share Mechanism (CSM) which foresees the split of the total amount of issued banknotes in the euro area between the different national central banks of the euro area with respect to their share in the capital of the ECB (8% of the total value of the euro area banknotes in circulation is allotted to the ECB). Coins (which are in fact the liability of the central government) are added to the total amount of banknotes. The item 'Cash' held by the MFIs is deducted from the total amount of currency (banknotes and coins).

The contribution of the Slovenia to the euro area monetary aggregates does not represent monetary aggregates of Slovenia. The concept of residency is the one of the euro area. Due to the consolidation within the MFI sector on the level of euro area countries the aggregate M3 could become smaller than M2.

Table 1.2.: Consolidated Balance Sheet of the Monetary Financial Institutions

The table shows the end of the month consolidated balance sheet of Bank of Slovenia and other monetary financial institutions, presented in the tables 1.3. and 1.4. The bilateral claims and liabilities of the sectors S.122 and S.121 are netted out. On the liability side of the balance sheet the liabilities to the central government sector (S.1311) in certain items are excluded and are included in the remaining liabilities.

The item 'Banknotes and coins' is for series after 1 January 2007 calculated on the basis of the Capital Share Mechanism (CSM) which foresees to split of the total amount issued in the euro area between the different National central banks of the euro area with respect to their share in the capital of the ECB (8% of the total value of the euro area banknotes in circulation is allotted to the ECB). Coins (which are in fact the liability of the central government) are added to the total amount of banknotes.

Table 1.3.: Balance Sheet of the Bank of Slovenia

The table shows the Bank of Slovenia's assets and liabilities at the end of month in line with the methodology of the ECB. According to the ECB's methodology the item 'Banknotes and coins' includes the data of coins in circulation (which are in fact the liability of the central government) and excludes the data of issued payment notes, which are included in the remaining assets.

The item 'Banknotes and coins' is for series after 1 January 2007 calculated on the basis of the Capital Share Mechanism (CSM) which foresees to split of the total amount issued in the euro area between the different National central banks of the euro area with respect to their share in the capital of the ECB (8% of the total value of the euro area banknotes in circulation is allotted to the ECB). Coins are added to the total amount of banknotes.

2. FINANCIAL MARKETS AND PAYMENT SYSTEMS

Interest rates (tables 2.1-2.4)

Table 2.1: Bank of Slovenia Interest Rates

Lombard loan: Within the framework of a standing Lombard facility, the Bank of Slovenia provides one-day Lombard loans to banks and savings banks with securities used as collateral. The pledged securities should amount to 110% of the amount of the Lombard loan.

The *repo interest rate* for the temporary purchase of treasury bills and tolar and foreign currency bills of the Bank of Slovenia with obligatory repurchase in seven days was the weighted arithmetic average of daily repo interest rates until March 2004 (effective interest rate). The new seven-day repo was introduced in March 2004; it is offered on a closed basis. The interest rate given is the latest valid interest rate.

Interest rate on banks' obligatory reserves: 1 percent per year since October 1991.

The overnight-deposit interest rate is an interest rate applying to deposits placed by banks and savings banks on an overnight term with the Bank of Slovenia.

Long-term deposit at the Bank of Slovenia was established in July 2004. The variable interest rate is defined once every two months for the next two-month period. It refers to the interest rate for 60-day tolar bills valid at the time of quotation, increased by 0.2 percentage points.

Tolar bills are registered securities subscribed by banks and savings banks with a maturity of 60 or 270 days. Sixty-day bills are offered on a permanent basis; 270-day bills were sold by auction until February 2004, and since then have been offered on a closed basis. Interest rates for tolar bills are given nominally; in the case of auctions they are effective rates. Offers of 270-tolar bills have been frozen since November 2004.

Foreign currency bills are transferable registered securities not issued in series. They are offered on a permanent basis and can be purchased by banks (or by other legal persons through banks until 3 May 2000). They are sold for euros (or German marks until February 1999, or U.S. dollars until June 2006) at a discount with maturities of two to four months.

A penalty rate is generally employed in cases of overdue payments. The penalty rate has been determined by the Law on the Legal Penalty Rate since 28 June 2003.

Interest rates for a certain type of instrument in the table are those last valid in a period (except in the case of effective interest rates). The annual averages of interest rates are computed as simple arithmetic averages of monthly data, if such data are available.

Table 2.2: Interbank Money Market Rates and Indexation Clause

Interbank market

SIONIA/SITIBOR

Until 31 December 2006, the figures are annual nominal interest rates for unsecured Slovenian tolar deposits on the Slovenian interbank market. The interest rate for overnight deposits (SIONIA) is the weighted average interest rate for overnight deposits.

SITIBOR is the rate at which Slovenian interbank term deposits are offered by one prime bank to another prime bank.

SIONIA and SITIBOR were valid from 14 July 2003 to 31 December 2006. Break of series in January 2007.

EONIA/EURIBOR

Eonia® (Euro OverNight Index Average) is the effective overnight reference rate for the euro. It is computed as a weighted average of all overnight unsecured lending transactions undertaken in the interbank market, initiated within the euro area by the contributing banks.

The Euro Interbank Offered Rate – "Euribor®" – is the money market reference rate for the euro. It is sponsored by the European Banking Federation, which represents the interests of 4,500 banks in 24 Member States of the European Union and Iceland, Norway and Switzerland, as well as the Financial Markets Association. Euribor® is the rate at which euro interbank term deposits are being offered within the EMU zone by one prime bank to another



Indexation clauses

TOM

The tolar indexation clause (TOM) is an annual interest rate calculated by the Statistical Office of the Republic of Slovenia and used for preserving the value of financial liabilities and assets in domestic currency.

TOM (monthly): since 5 August 1995, the average of the previous 3 months' inflation. (Until June 1995, indexation was based on the so-called R, which was equal to the previous month's inflation rate; from 1 June to 4 August 1995, indexation was based on the average of the previous 3 months' inflation.) From February 1996, 4 months; from December 1996, 6 months; and from May 1997, 12 months. Financial liabilities and assets in domestic currency with maturity less than 1 year have not been revalued since July 2002.

Foreign exchange indexation clause USD and CHF

The monthly rate is the growth rate of the end-of-month exchange rate for USD and CHF.

The annual rate is computed from the monthly rate on the conform basis, taking into account the actual number of days in the month and the year.

Table 2.3: European Central Bank Interest Rates

Counterparties can use the **deposit facility** to make overnight deposits with the NCBs. The interest rate on the deposit facility normally provides a floor for the overnight market interest rate.

Main refinancing operations are regular liquidity-providing reverse transactions with a frequency and maturity of one week. They are executed by the NCBs on the basis of standard tenders and according to a pre-specified calendar. The main refinancing operations play a pivotal role in fulfilling the aims of the Eurosystem's open market operations and provide the bulk of refinancing to the financial sector.

Counterparties can use the **marginal lending facility** to obtain overnight liquidity from NCBs against eligible assets. The interest rate on the marginal lending facility normally provides a ceiling for the overnight market interest rate.

Table 2.3.1.: Harmonised long-term interest rates for convergence assessment purposes

The long-term interest rate statistics refer to the monthly average interest rates for long-term government bonds issued by the central government, guoted as percentages per annum.

The fourth Maastricht criterion is based on the level of long-term interest rates. Article 4 of the Protocol on the convergence criteria, as referred to in Article 121 of the Treaty, states that compliance with the fourth convergence criterion "shall mean that, observed over a period of one year before the examination, a Member State has had an average nominal long-term interest rate that does not exceed by more than 2 percentage points that of, at most, the three best performing Member States in terms of price stability. Interest rates shall be measured on the basis of long-term government bonds or comparable securities, taking into account differences in national definitions."

The European Central Bank and the European Commission have, together with the national central banks, identified the representative debt securities that can be used to measure long-term nominal interest rates and, if necessary, alternative long-term interest rate indicators where suitable government bonds are not available

Data until December 2006 refer to the yield to maturity on a reference long-term general government bond, issued in Slovenian tolars and with a nominal interest rate. Since 1.1.2007 the data show the yield to maturity on a basket of long-term general government bonds, issued in euro and with a nominal interest rate.

Until 2003 a yield to maturity on a primary market is presented, and afterwards a yield to maturity on a secondary market.

2.4: Monetary Financial Institutions Interest Rates

Data from January 2003-April 2005

Estimates on MIR statistics refer to interest rates on new business applied by the eight biggest resident banks (selected by balance-sheet-total criterion) to loans denominated in Slovenian tolars vis-ŕ-vis domestic households and non-financial corporations.

Interest rates are calculated as a weighted average of all interest rates on new business in the instrument category.

Loans to non-financial corporations (breakdown by amount category): loans in SIT are converted into EUR by the monthly average exchange rate and then classified according to amount up to and including EUR 1 million, or over EUR 1 million.

"Loans to households for other purposes" include only loans to sole proprietors for current and capital assets.

Data on APRC in the period from January to August 2003 refer to six respondents, and from August 2003 to December 2003, to seven out of eight total respondents.

Data from May 2005-December 2006 covers business conducted in SIT by the total MFI population in Slovenia.

MFI interest rate statistics cover those interest rates that resident monetary financial institutions (MFIs, i.e. "credit institutions") apply to euro-denominated deposits and loans by households and non-financial corporations which are residents of the euro area.

The legal requirements for MFI interest rate statistics are laid down in Regulation ECB/2001/18, which defines the statistical standards according to which monetary financial institutions must report their interest rate statistics. This regulation is complemented by the Manual on MFI Interest Rate Statistics, which further clarifies and illustrates the statistical requirements. The MFI interest rate statistics refer to the interest rates individually agreed between a credit institution or other institution and its customer. They are converted to an annual basis, taking into account the frequency of interest payments, and are quoted in percentages per annum. At the euro area level 45 interest rate indicators with the corresponding volumes are collected, of which 31 refer to new business and 14 to outstanding amounts.

Outstanding amounts are defined as the stock of all deposits placed by customers, i.e. households and non-financial corporations, with credit institutions or other MFIs, and the stock of all loans granted by credit institutions to customers. An interest rate on outstanding amounts reflects the weighted average interest rate applied to the stock of deposits or loans in the relevant instrument category in the time reference period. Interest rates on outstanding deposits cover all deposits placed and not yet withdrawn by customers in all periods up to and including the reporting date. Interest rates on outstanding loans cover all loans used and not yet repaid by customers in all periods up to and including the reporting date, although excluding bad loans and loans for debt restructuring at rates below market conditions. MFI interest rates on outstanding amounts are hence statistics on the interest rates actually applied to all "open" deposits and loans.

New business is defined as any new agreement between the household or non-financial corporation and the credit or other institution. New agreements comprise all financial contracts, the terms and conditions of which specify for the first time the interest rate on the deposit or loan, and all new negotiations of existing deposits and loans. The prolongation of existing deposit and loan contracts which are carried out automatically, i.e. without any active involvement of the household or non-financial corporation, and which do not involve any renegotiating of the terms and conditions of the contracts, including the interest rate, are not considered new business.

The annual percentage rate of charge (APRC) is an effective lending rate that covers the total cost of credit to the consumer, i.e. the interest payments as well as all other related charges. It covers the total cost of credit to the consumer, as defined in Article 18(2) of the Consumer Credit Act. Charges defined in Article 18 of the Consumer Credit Act are excluded. APRC is compiled only for consumer credit and loans to households for house purchases (sole proprietors excluded).

Weighting method: The interest rates on new business are weighted by the size of the individual agreement.

The new interest rate statistics replace the average bank interest rates published by the Bank of Slovenia. The coverage and definition of the new statistics differ substantially from those previously published. Therefore, a direct comparison of the new and old rates is not possible.

The conversion rate for the Slovenian tolar is valid as of 1 January 2007, the conversion rate for the Cyprus pound and Maltese lira as of 1 January 2008 and the conversion rate for the Slovak koruna as of 1 January 2009.

Before SEPA IKP establishement the same transactions were processed in Giro Clearing payment system, operated by Banka Slovenije. Giro Clearing payment system was closed down on 1 August 2009. Data regarding transactions in the Giro Clearing payment system are published until March 2009. Data regarding transactions in both systems are published together (the sum of transactions in the Giro Clearing and SEPA IKP systems) for the period from March to July 2009. Data regarding payments in the SEPA IKP system are published from August 2009 on.

<u>Note 3:</u> Until 29th December 2006 payments data on domestic payments between Slovenian participants are published for domestic Slovenian RTGS system (values in billion Slovenian tolars). As of 1st January 2007 domestic payments of Slovenian TARGET participants represents payments sent from Slovenian credit institutions to another Slovenian payment institution, direct participated in the TARGET system.

As of 19th November 2007 payments in TARGET 2 system are considered.

Note 4: As of 1st January 2007 cross-border payments of Slovenian TARGET participants represents payments sent from Slovenian credit institutions to non-Slovenian credit institutions, direct participated in the TARGET system.

As of 19th November 2007 payments in TARGET 2 system are considered.

Note 5: Gross value is the total value of all payment orders executed in the payment system.

<u>Note 6:</u> Net value is the amount required for the settlement of the gross value of payments in a payment system that uses netting. It represents the sum of the net monetary liabilities of all participants of the payment system to other participants of the payment system, calculated as the positive difference between the payment orders sent to the system and the payment orders received from the system for each participants of the payment system in an individual settlement cycle.

Table 2.11 Payment Cards

Note 1: Credit card: A card indicating that the holder has been granted a line of credit. The credit granted may be settled in full by a specific date each month (delayed debit card, i.e. charge card), or may be settled in part, with the balance taken as extended credit (credit card).

Note 2: Debit card: A card which enables the holder to have purchases directly charged to funds on the cardholder's bank account.

Note 3: Cards issued abroad: Payment cards issued abroad and used for payments in Slovenia, mostly by non-residents.

Note 4: Volume and value of transactions abroad: Use of cards issued in Slovenia for payments abroad.

Number of payment cards *in circulation*: Number of valid payment cards held by residents and non-residents issued in Slovenia. Data refer to the end of each quarter/year.

Number and value of payments refer to the use of payment cards in each quarter/year.

Domestic card: Payment card issued by banks and enterprises resident in Slovenia without licence agreements with foreign issuers.

Licence card: Payment card issued by banks and enterprises resident in Slovenia under licence agreements with foreign issuers.

Bank card: Payment card issued by banks.

Retailer card: Payment card issued by non-banking institutions, mostly for use at specific retail outlets.

Personal card: Payment card issued to a natural person (family cards included).

Business card: Payment card issued to a legal entity.

A paper-based order is a payment instrument related to a credit or debit transfer, in which the payer submits an order on a paper-based form. In case of credit transfer it means any instruction by an account holder to his payment service provider requesting the transfer of funds from his account to another account (also between accounts of the same account holder). Includes submissions by telefax if they require manual intervention in order to be transformed into electronic payments.

Special payment order is a special form of paper-based payment order, which is issued by a payee (beneficiary) to be paid by the debtor. The special payment order is presented by the payer at the bank, which then debits his transaction account and transfers the amount to the account of the payee, potentially via several other credit institutions as intermediaries and/or one or more payment and settlement systems. A contemporary form can assure automated processing with ICR technology (Intelligent Character Recognition) or classic manual processing.

A non-paper-based credit transfer is any credit transfer which the payer submits without the use of paper forms i.e. electronically. Includes submissions by telefax or other means if they are transformed into electronic payments without manual intervention.

A standing order is a non-paper-based credit transfer and means an instruction from a payer to his bank to make a regular payment of a fixed amount to a named creditor. The payer authorises his bank (the bank at which he maintains a transaction account) to pay a specified amount regularly to another account. The payment must be repeated at least five times. The execution of payments occurs under exact conditions on a particular day of the month.

Direct credit is special form of payment instrument related to a credit transfer, initiated by the payer, which enables a cashless fund transfer from payer to payee. Direct credit is used for the execution of small value payments, e.g., salaries, pensions, dividends and similar payments, to a large number of creditors.

Table 2.15 Debit Transfers and Simply book-entry

Direct debit is an authorised debit on the payer's bank account initiated by the payee. It is a payment instrument consisting of automatic debiting of the debtor's account for goods and services delivered by the creditor. The debtor (payer) authorises his bank to transfer funds from his bank account to the creditor's account and the creditor to submit a payment order to the creditor's bank to be paid. A typical example is an electricity bill payment.

A special money order is a standardised paper-based debit instrument used to remit money to the named payee. A special money order is issued by a bank, allowing the individual named on the order form to receive a specified amount of cash on demand.

3. BALANCE OF PAYMENTS AND EXTERNAL POSITION

Balance of Payments

General notes

In most respects the Slovenian Balance of Payments (BOP) conforms to the methodology of the IMF's Balance of Payments Manual, fifth edition (1993).

Characteristics of the Data

Minus sign (-) indicates imports or surplus of imports over exports in the current account, increase in assets or decrease in liabilities in the capital and financial accounts, and growth of reserve assets.

Data on transactions are converted from the original currencies to EUR using the daily Bank of Slovenia or ECB's exchange rates, or average exchange rates for the period if the exact date of transaction is not known.

Revision policy

Revision of balance of payments, the international investment position and gross external debt data occur as follows:

Revisions in monthly data are published with the release of:

- the following month's data;
- the corresponding quarterly data;
- the corresponding revised quarterly data;
- the international investment position and external debt data for the corresponding year; and
- the revised international investment position and external debt data for the corresponding year.

Revisions in quarterly data are published with the release of:

- the following month's data;
- the data on the following quarter;
- the international investment position and external debt data for the corresponding year; and
 - the revised international investment position and external debt data for the corresponding year.

Revisions for the **annual** balance of payments, international investment position and external debt data are published with the release of the data for the following years.

Annual data are revised for the year t-1 and t-2. In the case of major methodological changes or discrepancies among the data sources, data for the year t-3 will be revised as well.

Data sources

- The external trade statistics (Statistical Office of the Republic of Slovenia) is the main source of data on trade in goods. Since 1 May 2004, the source of data on trade in goods among Slovenia and EU Member States is the Intrastat reporting. The source of data on trade in goods with other countries is the single administrative document (Exstrastat reporting).
- Reports on account balances and transactions between residents and non-residents (C, PPT, PPV):
 - report on account balances at domestic banks PPV (until 31 December 2004),
 - report on account balances abroad C (until 31 December 2006),
 - report on transactions through accounts at domestic banks PPT (until 31 December 2008),
 - report on transactions through accounts abroad C (until 31 December 2008).

All banks which conducted international payment transactions and all residents with open accounts abroad were obliged to report. The resident issuer/beneficiary of the payment was obliged to forward data on the type of transaction. Since 2009 only banks which conduct international payment transactions report transactions with nonresidents that exceed threshold EUR 50.000. Data are used for quality control purposes only.

- Reports on trade in services, part of trade in goods and on current/capital transfers with nonresidents (BST)
 are the sources of data on services (excl. travel), data on coverage adjustments of goods item and data on current and
 capital transfers (excl. transfers with EU budget) from 2008 onwards.
- Reports on transactions with securities (VRP) and data from the Securities Clearing Corporation (KDD) are the sources of portfolio investments (debt and equity securities) and financial derivates since 2004.
- Reports on purchased/sold foreign debt securities without domestic brokers (DVP) are the sources of portfolio investments in foreign debt securities, carried out without domestic brokers, from 2007 onwards.
- Data regarding drawn/un-drawn credit transactions from foreign credit registration forms (KR) are the source of data on loans of all sectors until 2004; in 2005 and 2006 they are only the source for the non-banking sector. A registration was obligatory for all financial credits and long-term commercial credits; since 1997 from the same source are also obtained the data on the purpose of direct payments of foreign lenders, used to settle the obligations of domestic borrowers to other non-residents.
- Reports on monetary financial institutions (PORFI) are the source for data on loans, cash and deposits of the banking sector since 2005.
- Reports on credits received and granted and deposits with non-residents (KRD) are the source for data regarding loans and deposit of all sectors, except banks, since 2007.
- Reports on short-term receivables and liabilities from operations with non-residents (SKV) are the source for short-term trade credits since 2002.
- **Reports on investments (SN)** are until 2007 the source for reinvested earnings of direct investments. From 2008 onwards these reports are source also for all other direct investment transactions in equity and related income as well as for portfolio equity transactions without involvement of domestic dealers.

Qarterly data on financial account's statistics are source for financial derivatives for all sectors except the central bank (since 2007).

Estimates and other sources

- estimate of purchases of foreign currency and cheques from foreigners in exchange offices (part of the travel category) until 2004.
- estimate of expenditures on travel abroad including purchases of goods abroad until 2004
- estimate of Italian pensions (UMAR) until the end of 1998,
- estimate of transactions with foreign currencies and the deposits of Slovene households (until 2006),
- estimate of labour income (SURS).
- data on pensions paid to non-residents (ZPIZ),
- survey on the write-downs of debt from trade in goods and services abroad,
- estimates for exports and imports of travel from 2005 onwards (detailed explanation under item Travel),
- estimate of cash transactions on tourism and labour income (from 2007 onwards).

Current account

Goods

Data regarding general goods can be obtained from the Statistical Office of the Republic of Slovenia. Prior to Slovenia's accession to the EU data were available from standard customs documents. Since 1 May 2004, data are available from single administrative documents for trade in goods with non-EU countries and from Intrastat reports for trade with EU Member States.

Adjustments of CIF/FOB – data on import by CIF value were adjusted to FOB value with the help of a coefficient which is equal to the weighted average of coefficients between CIF and FOB values of the goods imported (in an available sample), separated with regard to type of goods, type of transport and partner's country. For 2004, a new CIF/FOB coefficient was calculated (1.0306); prior to that the coefficient was 1.0393. Since 2004 on, the coefficient is calculated every year based on a five year average.

Coverage adjustments - made for goods exported and imported without customs declarations (the ITRS source until 2007, the reports of duty free shops and consignment warehouses until 2005, BST reports as source from 2008 onwards). Since 1 May 2004, coverage adjustments also include estimated data on imports of motor vehicles from EU by natural persons not covered by Intrastat System.

Services

Transport

Transportation services are classified according to mode of transport and furthermore according to what is carried. The source of records on transportation services is the ITRS until 2007 and BST reports from 2008 onwards.

Travel - methodology until 2004

The ITRS sources used in the compilation of the "Incoming travel" category include: a.) health- and education-related services; b.) payments made by non-residents to Slovenian tourist agencies; c.) net withdrawals in tolars from non-resident accounts; d.) money spent in casinos by non-residents; e.) data on sales of goods to non-residents in duty-free shops and consignment warehouses; f.) payments with credit cards; and g.) sales of tolars to non-residents abroad.

The data on sales of tolars to non-residents in Slovenia are estimated based on the number of border crossings by foreign travellers and on the number of nights spent in the country by foreign tourists.

Data for the category "Expenditure on travel" come from the ITRS and estimations.

Travel - methodology since 2005 onwards

Main data sources to estimate the export of travel are the following surveys and researches conducted by Statistical Office of the Republic of Slovenia (SURS):

- Survey on foreign tourists in summer season is used to define the structure of foreign tourists according to their primary aim of travel (business travel, health care, education, other) and expenditures of each type of foreign tourists; three-year's survey -last conducted in 2006)
- Survey on foreign travelers (to define the structure of travelers broken down by same-day travelers and transit travelers and their respective expenditures).
- Arrivals and over-night stays of foreign tourists broken down by countries of their residency (monthly survey).
- Number of border crossings (to define the population of foreigners entering Slovenia).

Based on data sources the following six categories of data are calculated and finally broken down by countries using data on mobile phone operators;

- Business travel,
- Health related travel,
- Education,

- Other,
- Same- day travelers,
- Transit travelers.

Main data source to estimate the import of travel is SURS's survey TU_ČAP (Quarterly survey on travel of domestic citizens). The Survey provides the value of expenditures of domestic population traveling abroad (same - day trips and longer trips) and the amount spent for transportation to and from the foreign destination, which is then subtracted from total expenditures in order to avoid double counting (since it is already included in transport services).

Based on TU_ČAP data source the following five categories of data are calculated and finally broken down by countries using data on mobile phone operators;

- Business travel.
- Health related travel.
- Education,
- Other
- Same day travelers.

Construction services

The source of data is the ITRS until 2007, all construction undertakings are recorded under construction services on net basis (the revenues earned on works performed abroad are recorded net of the corresponding expenditures). From 2008 onwards the sources of data on construction services are BST reports.

Insurance services

Premiums on life and non-life insurance are split into two components: (i) the service charge included in insurance services; and (ii) the premium in a narrow sense, recorded as a current transfer. The calculation of the service charge is based on a fixed percentage of premium payments. The source of data on insurance services is ITRS until 2007, this source was replaced by BST reports for 2008 data onwards. Insurance services include commissions of insurance companies and 45 % of premium payments. Insurance claims and other part of nonlife insurance premiums are included in current transfers, claims and part of life insurance premiums represent assets/liabilities of financial account.

Government services

All transactions settled through the accounts of Slovenian embassies abroad, as well as transactions coded as government services settled through the accounts of Slovenian banks with foreign correspondents, are included in this item until 2007 with the ITRS as the source of data. From 2008 onwards the source of data is BST report, government services include all services of slovenian representative bodies abroad.

Also for all other types of services the ITRS source has been discontinued as of 2008, when the new source (BST report) for data on trade in services (excl. travel) has been introduced.

Income

Labour income - receipts. Since 2002, data from the Labour Force Survey (SURS) and Eurostat data have replaced ITRS and estimates as sources of labour income for the work of Slovene residents abroad.

Labour income - expenditures. ITRS is the source for labour income - expenditures until 2004. Data relating to 2005 onwards are provided by SURS on the basis of Labour Office register for the number of nonresidents, who at the end of each quarter possess valid work permits and who actually worked in Slovenia less than one year and data by The Health Insurance Institute of Slovenia for nonresidents, who at the end of each quarter don't need valid work permits and who actually worked in Slovenia less than one year. Data on daily migrant workers from Austria, Italy, Hungary and Croatia are also included.

Since 2002, labour income (receipts and expenditures) is included according to the gross principle (including taxes and social contributions).

Capital income – Since 2004, VRP reports have replaced ITRS as a source for income from equity securities. Annual reports on capital investments are the source for data regarding reinvested earnings. Data on reinvested earnings in the current year are estimated - (a three year monthly average of actual data on total earnings, less extraordinary incomes [the source being annual reports on investments], is decreased by dividends and other incomes, paid in the current month (the source being monthly reports on investments from 1.1.2008 onwards, previously the source was ITRS). The estimate is replaced by actual data only when these data are available. Until 2003, the source of income from debt securities was ITRS; since 2004 the sources are reports on securities transactions (VRP reports) and KDD data. Until 2004, the source on income from other investments was ITRS for the banking sector; the source was later changed to reports on monetary financial institutions (PORFI). Until 2006, the source on income from other investments for the non-banking sector was ITRS; since 2007, the source is KDD reports. Income from loans (including long-tern commercial credits) and cash reserves have been managed according to the accrual principle since 2002; since 2007, total income from other investments is managed according to the same principle. Since 2004, the accrual principle is used for income from bonds and notes.

Current transfers

Current transfers of other sectors are subdivided into workers' remittances, insurance and other transfers. Current transfers of the government sector and other transfers of other sectors are from 2002 onwards subdivided into taxes, subsidies, social contributions, social benefits and other transfers. The main data sources are the ITRS and estimates until 2007, from

2008 onwards the sources are BST reports and from 2004 onwards, data on EU transfers of the government sector are obtained directly from the Ministry of Finance (budget data).

Capital and financial account

Capital account

Capital transfers

The ITRS is the source of data until 2007. Migrants' transfers cover not only payments recorded by domestic banks, but also the changes in residency of accounts held with these banks. From 2008 onwards data are obtained from BST reports, but data on capital transfers between the Republic of Slovenia and the EU are from 2004 onwards obtained directly from the Ministry of Finance (budget data). Since 2002, the Bank of Slovenia also estimates the value of write-downs of debt from trade in goods and services abroad.

Financial account

Direct investment

Direct investment is until 2007 recorded on the basis of reported payments through domestic banks and data from customs declarations, from 2008 the source is direct monthly report SN. Data on reinvested earnings are based on yearly surveys on balance and transactions with affiliated enterprises (SN) and are included monthly as one-twelfth of the yearly figure. Data regarding reinvested earnings for the current year are estimated. Until 1997, the purchase and sale of all shares and equity were included in this item.

From the beginning of 1997, purchase and sale of shares that assure more than 50 percent of a company's equity (a controlling interest of shares) and shares issued by domestic companies on the primary markets with the purpose of increasing the nominal capital of the company are included in this item, due to capital control measures. With the new Foreign Exchange Act in 1999, the 10% rule is applied to direct investment.

Since 2001, there is a break in the data series in the category "Direct Investments - Other Capital". Since that time, loans and long-term commercial credits between affiliated companies (10% or more of capital share) are included in this category. Until 2000, these types of transactions were included in the category "Other Investments". Since 2002, the category "Direct Investments - Other Capital" also includes short-included mannercial credits between companies.

Since 2005 other capital claims / liabilities does not include banking sector's claims/liabilities with direct investment relationship (these data are included in item other investment/loans.

Portfolio investment

Transactions are divided into assets and liabilities, with further breakdown into equity and debt portfolio investment. Until 1997 only data on sales and purchases of debt securities through banks were included in this item. Since February 1997 the equity securities with the exception of direct investment are included in this item too. With the new Foreign Exchange Act in 1999, portfolio investment transactions include all transactions below the 10% rule. Equity portfolio investment to individual sectors is subdivided into mutual funds and other investment. VRP and KDD data are the main sources from 2004 onwards. Since 2007 on this item includes also assets of debt portfolio instruments held by Bank of Slovenia, which are no longer considered as international reserves, but as claims to EMU member states and claims in EUR currency to all other nonresidents. From 2007 onwards data on transactions in assets of foreign debt instruments that occur without involvement of domestic dealers are collected on a report DVP, and from 2008 onwards assets and liabilities in portfolio equity investments deriving from transactions without involvement of domestic dealers are collected on report SN.

Financial derivatives

From 2004 until 2006 these types of transactions are included in VRP and KDD sources. Since 2007 qarterly data on financial account's statistics are source for financial derivatives for all sectors except the central bank. From 2009 onwards financial derivatives of Bank of Slovenia are included in other investment/financial derivatives item or international monetary reserves item (depending on the residency of the counterpart).

Other investments

Short-term trade credits

Until 2002, short-term trade credits were estimated based on the following calculation:

- {[export of goods FOB + coverage adjustments (export payments + free export of goods + direct investments in goods + drawings of granted long-term trade credits)]
- {[import of goods FOB + coverage adjustments (import payments + free import of goods + direct investments in goods + drawings of received long-term trade credits)]

Since 2002, short-term commercial credits are included based on SKV reports. Short-term trade credits between affiliated companies are included in direct investments.

Loans and long-term trade credits

From 2001 onwards, inter-company debt transactions between affiliated enterprises (10% or more capital share) are not recorded as loans, but are recorded as direct investment – other capital transactions. Loans (including long-term trade

credits) and related income have been calculated according to the accrual principle from 2002 onwards, and according to the cash principle prior to 2002. From 2005 onwards claims/liabilities of banking sector regardless of capital affiliation to nonresidents are included in this item (the direct investment relationships are not distinguished in the data source).

Currency and deposits

Until the adoption of Euro currency (1.1.2007) the foreign currency of residents is estimated based on the following formula: deposited currency and cheques on foreign currency accounts of individuals - withdrawals of cash and cheques from foreign currency accounts of individuals + the estimated net purchase of foreign currency by residents + estimated expenditures for tourist travel abroad + estimated expenditures of tourist travel to the former Yugoslavia + the estimated purchase of goods abroad - estimated labour expenditures abroad - estimated Italian pensions (until the end of 1998) + net withdrawals from non-resident accounts in local currency + the change of deposit balances of residents on accounts at BIS Member State banks (before 2002).

From the adoption of Euro currency (1.1.2007) onwards item foreign currency of households is estimated by using data on net inflows of foreign currency from tourism, data on net income on compensation of employees (decreased by consumption abroad/in the economy) and BIS (Bank for International Settlements) data on deposits held by residents with the banks abroad

Since 2002, the category "Accounts Abroad of Other Sectors" also includes BIS data regarding deposits of residents on accounts at BIS Member State banks.

With adoption of EUR in 2007 as a national currency Slovenia became a member of EMU which affects the following changes in currency and deposits item;

- the item currency and deposits/ claims includes also estimated counterpart of the transactions in cash in current account of the balance of payments (tourism and labour income),
- claims of the Bank of Slovenia to EMU member states and all claims in EUR currency to all other states are included in the item currency and deposits/ claims.
- net position of the Bank of Slovenia to the Eurosystem (net result of incoming and outgoing payments conducted in EUR currency through TARGET and STEP2 system) is included in the item currency and deposits/ other liabilities.

International monetary reserves

Reserve assets and related income have been calculated according to the accrual principle from 2002 onwards, and according to the cash principle prior to 2002.

Following Slovenia's entry to the EMU in 2007, claims to other residents of the euro area (denominated in euros and in other currencies) and claims in euros to EMU non-residents are not included in reserve holdings. From 2007 onwards, these transactions are shown in the appropriate categories of the capital and financial account sector of the Bank of Slovenia (investments in securities and other investments).

International monetary reserves item includes also financial derivatives (from 2009 onwards).

Table 3.1: Balance of Payments 1988-1993

The balance of payments is based on the methodology of the International Monetary Fund (Balance of Payments Manual, IMF, 1993). The balance of payments for the period 1998 - 1991 does not include transactions with republics of the former Yugoslavia. The import and export of goods is shown without processing transactions, processing is included in services.

Note 1: For 1988 and 1989, official sector data is included in "Other sectors".

Note 2: For 1988 through 1990, "Statistical errors" include sales of claims from bilateral agreements to the former National Bank of Yugoslavia and its purchases of foreign currency through Slovenian foreign currency exchange offices.

Note 3: Reserve assets of the Bank of Slovenia.

Table 3.2: Balance of Payments

The data for the current year are revised monthly. Data become final according to the revision practice (see revision practice).

In June 2001, Slovenia acquired a 16.39% share in the holdings of the former Yugoslavia with the Bank for International Settlements (BIS), consisting of gold SIT 16.9 mio (EUR 77.8 million), foreign currencies SIT 1.1 mio SIT (EUR 5.3 million) and shares SIT 3.0 mio (EUR 13.8 million). This transaction is not considered to be a flow of the balance of payments, but rather a part of the "Other changes" category, which reconciles the international investment position in consecutive periods

* Years 1994 in 1995: Data for balance of payments in ECU for years 1994 and 1995 are not obtained in the same manner as data for other years. The data for merchandise trade are converted from US dollar to ECU using average monthly exchange rates. The data for merchandise trade in Euros or ECU since 1996 are computed from values in original currencies using daily exchange rates for Euro or ECU.

Note 1: Exports and imports of goods - f.o.b. parity

Note 2: June 1996: Includes the issue of government bonds in exchange for a part of allocated foreign debt in the amount of SIT 63.7 mio (EUR 374.9 million). Banks' liabilities under foreign loans are decreased for the same amount and transferred to "Liabilities to government".

Note 4: For 1993–2001, short-term claims include net changes in commercial credits (received and granted). From 2002 onwards, short-term commercial credits are included on the basis of SKV reports on the assets and liabilities side of the balance of payments. Short-term commercial credits between affiliated enterprises are included under the heading "Direct investments", while other commercial credits are included in "Other investments/trade credits".

Note 5: Includes mostly Bank of Slovenia fiduciary accounts. In June 1996 the amount of 21.2 mio SIT (EUR 124.9 million) was transferred to regular Bank of Slovenia reserve accounts.

Note 6: Use of IMF credit (assumed upon membership in January 1993).

Note 7: Reserve assets of the Bank of Slovenia. Following Slovenia's entry to the EMU in 2007, claims to other residents of the euro area (denominated in euros and other currencies) and claims in euros to EMU non-residents are not included in reserve holdings. From 2007 onwards, these transactions are shown in the appropriate categories of the capital and financial account sector of the Bank of Slovenia (investments in securities and other investments). Note 8: The data on reinvested earnings for 2009 are not yet available. Therefore, the balance of payments includes an estimate (from the three year monthly average for the period 2006 to 2008 of actual data on total earnings less extraordinary incomes [the source being annual reports on investments], less dividends and other incomes paid in the current month). In 2010, the estimate will be replaced with actual data on reinvestment of earnings; the estimate for 2009 shall take into consideration the new three year average (2007 to 2009).

<u>Note 9</u>: From 2001 onwards, there is a time series break in the categories "Direct investment" and "Loans". From 2001, inter-company debt transactions between affiliated enterprises (10% or more capital share) are included in the "Direct investment" category; before that they were included under the heading "Loans". Since 2002, the category "Direct investments" also includes short-term trade credits between affiliated enterprises.

Note 10: Transfers from the EU budget since 2004 have been recorded as either current or capital transfers, according to the nature of their use. Data are provided by the Ministry of Finance.

Note 11: In the balance of payment of Slovenia to the EMU the presentation of the category net of errors and omissions does not make sense.

Tables 3.3 and 3.4: Current account and capital and financial account by countries

The tables show the main categories of current and capital and financial account of the balance of payments, by countries, for the last available year. The most important countries and/or groups of countries are shown.

Table 3.5.: Trade in goods by countries

The data source is the Statistical Office of the Republic of Slovenia (external trade statistics). Import is valued at FOB parity; export is valued at CIF parity. The data for 2009 are provisional.

International Investment Position of Slovenia

General notes

The international investment position is the balance sheet of the stock of external financial assets and liabilities. The financial items that constitute the position consist of claims on non-residents, liabilities to non-residents, monetary gold and SDRs.

The methodology of the international investment position (IIP) of Slovenia is based on the fifth edition of the Balance of Payments Manual, IMF, 1993. The manual distinguishes four sectors – monetary authorities, general government, banks and other sectors.

The structure of the statement is similar to the balance of payments (financial account): here as well are holdings and

liabilities, first classified by instruments, followed by sectors and finally by maturity. The change to the balance of holdings and liabilities in a specific period is the result of transactions or flows shown in the balance of payments and also exchange rate changes, price changes and other changes.

Revision policy

See note "Revision policy" in the section "Balance of Payments".

Data sources

Data sources for the international investment position of Slovenia are mainly the same as those for the financial account of the balance of payments.

Direct investment

Data on direct investment are collected from:

- concessional surveys on equity investment (SN),
- reports on loans granted to or received from non-residents (KR) until 2006,
- reports on accounts abroad (C) until 2006,
- short-term commercial credits with non-residents (SKV), and
- assets and liabilities in loans and deposits to nonresidents (KRD) for non-bank sectors since 2007.

In accordance with the recommendations of the IMF, this item comprises investment where the direct investor owns 10% or more of ordinary shares or voting power. Equity shares are until 2006 valued at book value according to accounting standards. From 2007 the equity of listed companies is recorded according to market value and equity of unlisted companies is recorded according to book value in line with accounting standards. Reinvested earnings are included.

Claims on and liabilities to affiliated enterprises are included in the category "Direct investment-other capital". Intercompany claims or liabilities between affiliated banks and affiliated financial intermediaries recorded under direct investment capital are limited to those associated with permanent debt (loan capital respresenting a permanent interest). Until 2000, all long-term intercompany claims were considered liabilities between affiliated banks, and affiliated financial intermediaries were included in this item as well as permanent debt. From 2005 onwards other capital item of direct investment does not include claims/liabilities of banking sector to affiliated enterprises (those data are included in item other investment/ loans).

Data on claims and liabilities of Slovene enterprises in indirectly-affiliated enterprises from 1996 onwards are included in the category "Direct investment abroad" (in cases where an enterprise abroad having Slovene direct investment holds 10% or more equity in another foreign enterprise). In the category "Direct investment in Slovenia", data on the investment of foreign enterprises in indirectly-affiliated enterprises in Slovenia are included (in the case that a Slovene enterprise with foreign direct investment holds 10% or more equity in another Slovene enterprise). From 2007 all claims and liabilities to foreign direct investors/ direct investment enterprise and fellow companies that belong to the same foreign direct investor / direct investment enterprise are included.

Portfolio investment

Until 2002, data on equity securities and other equity shares were available from enterprises' surveys (form SN), but only data from surveys where the direct investor owns less than 10% of ordinary shares or voting power are included. (In the balance of payments, transactions with equity securities and other shares are collected from the ITRS [see note to tables 3.1–3.4] /Capital and financial account/Portofolio investment.) From 2007 data on equity shares bellow 10% that are traded without involvement of domestic dealers are collected (report SN).

From 2003 onwards, data from the reports VRP (operations in securities reported by brokerage houses, banks and investment companies) and KDD (Central Securities Clearing Corporation) are included. Also data on investments in mutual funds and investments of households in other equity securities are available since 2003. From 2007 data on assets of foreign debt securities that are traded without involvement of domestic dealers are collected (report DVP).

Data on residents' holdings of debt securities are available from VRP direct reports.

Liabilities of debt securities of the government, banking and other sectors are available from credit registration and Central Securities Clearing Corporation data (KDD). For domestic securities issued abroad, the source is VRP reports.

Financial derivates

From 2004 until 2006 these data are included in VRP and KDD sources. Since 2007 qarterly data on financial account's statistics are source for financial derivatives for all sectors except the central bank.

Trade credits and loans

The source for short-term trade credits is a report of enterprises on the stock of external assets and liabilities (form SKV).

Sources for long-term trade credits and loans are credit registration forms (until 2006 forms KR, from 2007 onwards forms KRD) and are the same for the international investment position and the balance of payments. Until 2000, the balance of payments did not distinguish loans between affiliated companies from loans between unaffiliated companies and included all loans in other investment items.

From 2005 onwards monetary statistics (PORFI) is the source for banking sector data (claims and liabilities are included regardless of direct investment affiliation).

Currency and deposits, other assets, other liabilities and reserve assets

For these categories, the sources largely coincide with the sources for the balance of payments:

- the accounting data of commercial banks (KNB) until 2004.
- the account balances of banks in original currencies (PPV) until 2004,
- the account balances abroad of companies (C) until 2006,
- assets and liabilities in loans and deposits to nonresidents (KRD) for non-bank sectors since 2007
- the source for banking sector data (PORFI) since 2005,

- the accounts of the Bank of Slovenia

In the International Investment Position, mature, unpaid loans and long-term commercial credits are included in other holdings and liabilities as short-term items. These transactions are not included in the balance of payments.

Until 2002, there is a difference between the International Investment Position and the balance of payments for other liabilities and holdings of other sectors, where contractual joint ventures are shown in the investment position. The source for this item is a JV report.

The International Investment Position includes data of the Bank for International Settlements (BIS) on deposits of local residents at BIS Member State banks. Since 2001, an estimate of the balance of foreign currency held by households is also included. However, any further investments of foreign currencies (primarily investments in real estate abroad and foreign securities, without domestic brokers) are not excluded from this estimate, since data of this type are not available.

Net position of the Bank of Slovenia to the Eurosystem (net result of incoming and outgoing payments conducted in EUR currency through TARGET and STEP2 system) is also included in the item liabilities/currency and deposits.

Table 3.6: International Investment Position of Slovenia

IIP data do not include:

- data on real estate owned by Slovenian households abroad (mainly real estate in Croatia); from 2001 onwards, these
 data are partially included under the heading "Assets/other investment/currency and deposits/households"; and
- claims on other countries in the territory of the former Socialist Federal Republic of Yugoslavia, subject to negotiations on succession (except the part reported by the Fund of the Republic of Slovenia for Succession from 2001 onwards), expropriated assets in these territories and other assets transferred to the Slovenian government during the process of privatization. In December 2006 claims subject to succession to former Yugoslavia were revalued and 'Sklad RS za sukcesijo' was transformed into 'Javna Agencija Republike Slovenije za nasledstvo',
- data on foreign ownership of real estate in Slovenia.

Gross External Debt

General notes

The methodology is based on External Debt Statistics: Guide for Compilers and Users, IMF, 2003. The guide is available at the following Web address: http://www.imf.org/external/pubs/ft/eds/Eng/Guide/index.htm.

Revision policy

See note "Revision policy" in the section "Balance of Payments".

Data sources

In order to maintain consistency, the data sources are the same as those for the International Investment Position. The sources for equities and financial instruments are not used because these types of instruments are not included in the balance of external debt according to the IMF definition.

Tables 3.8 and 3.9: Net External Debt

The tables present gross external debt, gross external assets in debt instruments, and net debt position. The data are the same as presented in the international investment position (IIP). In the table "Net External Debt", data are sorted by sectors, maturities and instruments; in the table "International Investment Position", data are sorted by instrument, sectors and maturities.

Tables 3.10 and 3.11: Gross External Debt

Gross external debt, at any given data, is the outstanding amount of those current, and not contingent, liabilities that require payment(s) of principal and/or interest by the debtor at some point(s) in the future and are owed to non-residents by residents of an economy. The types of financial instruments included in the presentation of the gross external debt position are as follows: debt securities (money market instruments, bonds and notes), trade credits (short- and long-term), loans (short- and long-term), cash, deposits and other debt liabilities. Maturity of debt liabilities is based on the formal criterion of original maturity. Long-term debt is defined as debt with an original maturity of more than one year or with no maturity stated. Short-term debt, which includes cash, is debt repayable at notice or with an original maturity of one year or less.

International reserves

Table 3.12.: International reserves

Until December 2006, the Bank of Slovenia's foreign exchange reserves included convertible foreign currencies, deposits abroad and first-class securities of foreign issuers.

From 1 January 2007, the Bank of Slovenia's foreign exchange reserves include convertible foreign currencies, deposits in foreign currencies outside the euro area and first-class securities in foreign currencies of issuers outside the euro area. The decline of value presented in the data is due to Slovenia's inclusion in the EMU.

Since 2009 foreign exchange reserves of the Bank of Slovenia include also positions on financial derivatives based on daily pricing of these instruments. The value of financial derivatives may also be negative.

4. PUBLIC FINANCE

General

Data prior to 2007 are published in tolars; from 2007, data are published in euros. Quarterly and yearly data on Gross domestic product are not yet reconciled.

General - methodology ESA 95

Non-financial and financial data are prepared in compliance with the European System of Accounts from the year 1995 (ESA 95). This methodology was adopted by Council Regulation (EC) No. 2223/96 of 25 June on the European System of Accounts in the Community.

ESA 95 methodology is the central economic methodology of each EU member state and therefore ensures comparability of data.

Data on non-financial accounts of general government are prepared by the Statistical Office of the Republic of Slovenia. In accordance with a memorandum of understanding between the Ministry of Finance, the Bank of Slovenia and the Statistical Office of the Republic of Slovenia, the data on financial accounts are compiled by the Bank of Slovenia.

The data on financial accounts are consolidated.

Table 4.1: Non-financial and Financial Accounts (ESA 95) of the General Government sector

EDP debt is gross debt as defined in the Maastricht treaty. It comprises general government liabilities in the form of currency (coins), deposits, debt securities (securities other than shares and other equity) and loans only.

Tables 4.2 and 4.3: Non-financial Account of the General Government sector

Fiscal burden is a sum of the direct taxes, indirect taxes, social contributions and capital taxes.

Intermediate consumption consists of the value of the goods and services consumed as inputs by a process of production. The goods and services may be either transformed or used up by the production process.

Tables 4.4 and 4.5: Financial Account of the General Government sector

Change in EDP debt is a difference between the current and preceding EDP debt figure.

Deficit-debt adjustment (DDA) is a sum of the deficit/surplus of non-financial account and change in EDP debt. DDA can be also calculated as a sum of the difference between financial assets and liabilities (which are not included in EDP debt) and other flows.

Other liabilities consist of data, which are not included in the EDP debt: financial derivatives, shares and other equity, insurance technical reserves and other liabilities.

Other flows are sum of the statistical discrepancy (difference between deficit/surplus of non-financial and financial account) and changes of the debt which are not transactions (foreign exchange holding gains and losses, other valuation effects, other changes in volume of debt).

Borrowing requirement consists of a negative deficit/surplus of financial account plus financial assets minus financial liabilities

Table 4.6: Revenues and Expenditures of the General Government

Note 1: The data of the current and previous year are revised monthly until the data on the previous year become final.

Note 2: Total revenue excludes receipts from the EU, and likewise, total expenditure excludes payments to the EU budget.

Note 3: Current expenditure also includes social security contributions (besides of the expenditures on goods and services, interest payments, current reserves and current transfers).

Tables 4.7: Lending, Repayments and Financing of the General Government

General government operations (consolidated state budget, local governments, pension fund and health insurance fund).

Note 1: The data of the current and previous year are revised monthly until the data on the previous year become final.

Table 4.8: Central budget debt

The Republic of Slovenia is defined as a legal person. The data from tables 4.6., 4.7. and 4.8. originate in the Bulletin of Government Finance published by the Ministry of Finance.

The obligation of the Central budget of Republic of Slovenia to Bank of Slovenia is due to settlement of the Special drawing rights of the International monetary fund by Bank of Slovenia as a fiscal agent, in line with the agreement between the Ministry of finance of Republic of Slovenia and Bank of Slovenia.

5. FINANCIAL ACCOUNTS

Financial accounts (Tables 5.1 to 5.6)

Tables 5.1, 5.2, 5.4 and 5.5 show stocks and transactions in financial assets and liabilities held by individual institutional sectors, by individual financial instruments. The basis for the financial accounts methodology is ESA95.

Tables 5.3 and 5.6 present net items by individual sectors.

Net financial assets present difference between financial assets and liabilities (stocks).

Net financial transactions present difference between transactions in financial assets and transactions in liabilities.

The general principle for stocks and transactions is valuation at the current market price. As a rule accrued interest is included in the instrument to which it relates (deposits, loans, securities).

The transactions represent the difference between increases (acquisitions) and decreases (disposals) or the net turnover in an individual financial instrument. Changes in market prices and exchange rates, and other changes (reallocations of financial instruments/sectors, changes in methodology, write-downs of claims/debts, etc.) are excluded from the transactions.

Sectors, according to SKIS, are used.

Financial instruments in financial accounts

Individual financial instruments are the same among assets and liabilities, except Monetary gold and SDRs which only appear in financial asset tables.

Monetary gold and SDRs represent financial assets of the central bank. No other institutional unit or sector shall show a liability from the above mentioned instruments.

Currency and deposits consists of three sub-categories of financial instruments:

- currency represents bank notes and coins normally used for payments and includes bank notes and coins in circulation and represents the liability of the unit which issued them (as a rule, the central bank). The category "Household Currency and NIPSH (non-profit institutions serving households)" includes the foreign currency of residents which is estimated based on net purchases.
- transferable deposits consist of sight deposits in domestic or foreign currency. Transferable deposits can be converted into currency or transferred by cheque, payment order, debit entry or the like, without significant restrictions or additional costs.
- other deposits consist of deposits that cannot be used to make payments at any time and are not convertible into currency or transferable deposits without significant restrictions or additional costs.

Securities, excluding shares, are comprised of the following:

- short-term debt securities (with an original maturity of up to one year bills and other short-term debt securities);
- long-term debt securities (with an original maturity of more than one year: bonds);
- financial derivatives (options, swaps, standardised futures, interest rate futures and warrants).



Loans consist of all types of loans created when creditors lend funds to debtors, either directly or through brokers, that are either evidenced by non-negotiable documents or not evidenced by documents. The initiative concerning a loan normally lies with the borrower. Loans also include loans for financing trade credits, financial leasing, repurchase agreements, and repayable margin payments related to financial instruments when these agreements and payments are liabilities of corporations that are not monetary financial institutions. Loans do not include trade credits or advances.

Loans are broken down into short-term loans (with an original maturity of up to one year) and long-term loans (with an original maturity of more than one year).

Shares and other equities represent:

- Shares which are quoted (on a domestic of foreign market);
- Unquoted shares;
- Other equities:
- Shares/units of investment funds.

Shares/units of investment funds include shares of investment companies, investment coupons (referring to one or more units of mutual funds) and units of pension funds.

Insurance technical reserves comprise the insurance technical reserves of insurance corporations and pension funds against policyholders and beneficiaries, and are divided into three sub-categories of financial instruments.

Net equity of households in life insurance reserves including:

- net life insurance provisions;
- net provisions for life insurance policies where the investment risk is borne by the policyholders;
- net health insurance provisions.

Net equity of households in pension fund reserves consists of provisions deriving from pensions.

Prepayments of insurance premiums and reserves for outstanding claims represent net prepayments of insurance policies, net reserves for outstanding claims and other net insurance technical reserves.

Other assets and liabilities are broken down as follows:

- Commercial credits and advances;
- Other (other assets and liabilities, excluding commercial credits and advances).

Commercial credits and advances consist of financial claims or liabilities arising from the direct extension of credit by suppliers or buyers for goods and services transactions, and advance payments for work that is in progress or to be undertaken and associated with such transactions.

Other (other assets and liabilities excluding commercial credits and advances) consists of all other claims and liabilities arising from timing differences between transactions and payments made in respect of taxes, social contributions, wages, rents, dividends, interest and transactions in financial assets on the secondary market. As a rule, accrued interest is included in the instrument to which it relates. However, should it be impossible to include the interest in the relevant instrument, it is disclosed in the category "Other".

Financial accounts data may differ from other statistical data because of:

- valuation method (current market value),
- data sources,
- time of data recording,
- time of data revision,
- methodological differences in financial instrument classification and
- other methodological differences.

Data for the period before the 1st of January 2007 are converted into EUR based on exchange rate 1 EUR = 239,64 SIT.

6. NON-FINANCIAL ACCOUNTS AND GENERAL ECONOMIC STATISTICS

General notes

The Standard Classification of Activities is defined by the Decree on the Introduction and Use of the Standard Classification of Activities (Official Gazette of the Republic of Slovenia, No. 69/2007, 17/2008) and is in line with the classification of activities NACE Rev.2(Nomenclature statistique des activités économiques dans la Communanté européenne) as a compulsory statistical standard of the European Union, which is directly connected to the international classification of the activities of United Nations ISIC Rev. 4(International Standard Industrial Classification).

The basic activities of an economy are:

- A Agriculture, forestry and fishing
- B Mining and quarrying
- C Manufacturing
- D Electricity, gas steam and air conditioning supply
- E Water supply, sewerage, waste management and remediation activities
- F Construction

General

Data prior to 2007 are published in tolars; from 2007, data are published in euros.

Non-financial accounts and general economic statistics (Tables 6.1 to 6.8)

Tables 6.1 and 6.2: Expenditure of Gross Domestic Product

Real yearly growth rates are calculated from the GDP data in constant prices, reference year 2005.

Tables 6.3 and 6.4: Gross Domestic Product by Activity

Real yearly growth rates are calculated from the GDP data in constant prices, reference year 2005.

Tables 6.5 and 6.6: Industrial Production Index

For the period from January 1992 to January 2004, industrial production indices are calculated from quantitative data on the production of industrial products.

From February 2004 onwards, the basis for calculating the production indices are data on the value of production.

Tables 6.7 and 6.8: Turnover and New Orders in Industry

Data for the year 2008 are provisional.

For the period from January 1998 to January 2003, indices on turnover are estimated on the basis of the monthly data on the quantity of sold industrial products and the average annual prices of industrial products. Data from February 2003 onwards are gathered with the regular monthly survey on turnover, new orders and value of stocks in industry.

Real yearly growth rates are calculated from the real index on turnover and new orders in industry. The deflator is the industrial producer prices index.

Tables 6.9 and 6.10: Business Tendency and Consumer Surveys

The sentiment indicator is the weighted average of the confidence indicator in manufacturing and retail trade, plus the consumer confidence indicator. Sentiment indicators of certain activities or consumers are calculated from answers shown in the table.

The results are shown as a balance by individual questions. The balance is the difference between positive and negative answers, expressed as percentages. The balance shows the movement of the observed economic indicator (present situation or future expectations), and not the real size of economic indicators.



Table 6.11: Employment by Labour Force Survey (ILO)

The Slovene Labour Force Survey was carried out in compliance with International Labour Organisation (ILO) guidelines for labour force statistics and with Eurostat requirements. This enables the comparability of our data to the data of other countries.

Data in column 5 - self-employed persons include family-member assistants as well.

Note 1: From 2008 onwards the revised classification of activities SKD 2008 is used, which is internationally comparable with the NACE Rev. 2 classification of activities.

Table 6.12: Unemployment by Labour Force Survey (ILO)

The Slovene Labour Force Survey was carried out in compliance with International Labour Organisation (ILO) guidelines for labour force statistics and with Eurostat requirements. This enables the comparability of our data to the data of other countries.

Table 6.13: Average Wages and Salaries

Real wages and salaries are deflated by the consumer price index (CPI).

From January 2005 onwards a new methodology for the calculations of average monthly wages and salaries has been used. The statistical survey also includes legal entities with one or two persons in paid employment in the private sector. Individual private entrepreneurs and persons employed by them, own account workers and farmers are not covered.

Published data are the results of new research: the Monthly Report on Earnings at Legal Entities. Data are collected by the Agency of the Republic of Slovenia for Public Legal Records and Related Services (with the common questionnaire (Form 1–ZAP/M). Statistical work was done by SORS. SORS also calculated the average monthly wages and salaries data for 2004 according to the new methodology.

The growth of the index value represents decrease of competitiveness.

Tables 6.15 and 6.16: Consumer Price Index

The Harmonized Index of Consumer Prices (HICP) is a comparable index of consumer prices produced by each Member State and used for international comparison of consumer price inflation. In Slovenia it is available from the year 2001 onwards.

Tables 6.17 and 6.18: Industrial Producer Price Index

The index of industrial producer prices measures changes in the level of producer prices of industrial products that are sold by producers on the Slovenian market. The tables show the price indices and growth rates by end-use of products, as well as by main divisions of activities, v2 (2008).
